GALATIANS 5:1,13-25

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.

For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another.

Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.



ANNOUNCEMENTS



Dear St. Michael's Family,

After many years of praying and planning, your remodel committee, vestry, and I am excited to announce that beginning on **Monday, July 25, 2022**, St. Michael's will have our first remodel since our sanctuary was built in 1958.

During the remodel we will be worshipping in **Quigley Hall** starting on Sunday, July 31st through Sunday, September 18th. We will return to our remodeled sanctuary on Sunday, September 25th just in time to celebrate **ST. MICHAEL'S DAY** including a visit from Bishop Greg Brewer.

HERE IS AN OUTLINE OF THE SCOPE OF THE SANCTUARY REMODEL:

REFINISH THE PEWS

- Remove the pews in the chapel and balcony.
- Remove, strip, sand, stain, and finish the pews from the sanctuary/nave and the choir.
- Replace the kneelers for the pews in the nave, chapel, and balcony.
- Remove and replace the rail cap in the nave.
- Install refinished pews 3" farther to the sides of the church so that the main aisle is 6" wider (aligned with the door frame).
- Refinish the platform (oak floor) under the altar and choir area.

INSTALL NEW SLATE FLOORS

- Remove all flooring from the church, narthex, steps, balcony, chapel, columbarium, and sacristy.
- Install new carpeting in the narthex, on the balcony and steps, and in the rooms in the sacristy.
- Install slate tile in the sanctuary/nave, chapel, columbarium, and sacristy hallway.

PAINT

- Refinish the frontals on the balcony.
- Remove the “grasscloth” wallpaper in the chapel and paint the surface and any other exposed walls.
- Seal the concrete block walls along the sides of the church.
- Seal the beams that support the ceiling in the church.
- Paint the railings that are on the stairs to the balcony.
- Seal the brick wall behind the choir.
- Touch up and refinish the frontals in the balcony and scratches in the wood in the chapel.

ADDITIONAL PROJECTS:

- QUIGLEY HALL UPGRADE: Repurpose and upgrade 30-year-old sound panels with new fabric, repair/replace damaged panels, and reinstall. Install new window shades.
- ROWE HALL UPGRADE: Install a new air conditioning unit for Sunday classrooms and Pre-school. Install new roof. Pre-school/Children’s Ministry: refurbish the playground

The overall cost is \$600,000+ and we have raised about 75% of the funds necessary to complete the projects. We welcome any financial gifts. **Thank YOU for your faithful financial generosity and support in making this remodel possible!**

Also, a special thanks to our REMODEL COMMITTEE who has spent numerous hours developing, preparing, and will oversee this project, and the various ministries and guilds for helping make this transition smooth and stress-free.

Once the project begins, we’ll provide updates on our progress!

THE MINISTRY OF SPIRITUAL DIRECTION

New Class begins September 2022

The Center for Spiritual Formation offers a two-year online Spiritual Direction training for pastoral leaders and laypersons.

Spiritual Direction is companionship given by one Christian to another which enables that person to listen for the direction of the Holy Spirit as a person opens his/her life to God's presence; to respond to God's guidance; to grow in intimacy with God; and to live out the beauty of the relationship. The program is intended to assist those who participate in sharpening listening skills, bring clarity to areas of giftedness, and acquire the tools and practices essential to caring for souls in love.

YEAR ONE focuses on the history, traditions and models, Biblical roots and theological foundations of Spiritual Direction. It highlights the differences between psychological counseling and Spiritual Direction and demonstrates a contemplative approach to God.

YEAR TWO focuses on the actual practice of Spiritual Direction: developing listening and assessment skills; becoming familiar with displacement and projection, transference and counter-transference; acquiring a working knowledge of the life-stages of faith development; cultivating an increased awareness of the power of prayer and healing; and learning the importance of supervision.



The Ministry of Spiritual Direction Program creates space for those participating to:

- Gain or deepen one's understanding, sensitivity, and insight into the workings of the Holy Spirit.
- Create awareness of the need for an ever-growing connection between the inner life of the Spirit and the outer life of faithfulness to the Spirit's direction.
- Facilitate a deepening prayer life and a greater contentment with silence and solitude.
- Equip those participating to deal with strong emotions and maintain relationships over time.
