### SR 9/I-95 Northbound (NB) Exit Ramp at SR 706/Indiantown Road Improvements Project

### SR 9/I-95 NB EXIT RAMP AT SR 706/INDIANTOWN ROAD—SEPT./OCT. 2024 PROGRESS REPORT

Saturday, October 19, 2024 marks contract day 356 of 614, with work 57% completed. Project improvements include but are not limited to milling and resurfacing the existing roadway, widening the Indiantown Road Bridge over the C-18 canal (located just west of Island Way) in both directions to provide an additional through lane, and re-aligning the I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road to a new signalized intersection. The project is currently anticipating completion in Summer 2025. ### WORK PERFORMED IN SEPTEMBER 2024

- Bridge deck forming, reinforcing steel installation, and concrete bridge deck pouring for bridge widening on the outside lanes of Indiantown Road over the C-18 canal in the eastbound direction
- Shoulder widening operations on eastbound Indiantown Road from Island Way to Central Boulevard
- Directional boring operations and installation of mast arms for signal installation at the new I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road
- Sidewalk excavation and embankment work on eastbound Indiantown Road east of Florida's Turnpike

### CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES ONGOING IN OCTOBER 2024

- Drilled shaft installation for overhead signage structures
- Curb, gutter and sidewalk installation on eastbound then westbound Indiantown Road, including upgrades to the curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards
- Construction of the bridge approach slabs and bridge joints over the C-18 canal
- Permanent barrier wall and sidewalk installation on eastbound Indiantown Road over Florida's Turnpike

### NEW TRAFFIC SIGNAL ACTIVATION ANTICIPATED FOR LATE OCTOBER/EARLY NOVEMBER 2024

- The new traffic signal at the I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road will be on 'yellow' flash mode prior to the new ramp opening, visible in the eastbound and westbound directions on Indiantown Road
- When traffic is shifted to the newly constructed I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road (located just west of the existing exit ramp) the signal will activate to 'red, yellow, green' mode

### RAMP IMPACTS

- The I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road will have one lane closed around-the-clock through October 2024
- A full closure is expected to permanently shift traffic to the newly constructed I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road. Advance notice will be provided.
