INTERSECTION RECONSTRUCTION AT SR 5/FEDERAL HIGHWAY AND 3RD AVENUE S

- SR 5/Federal Highway at 3rd Avenue South will be closed daily, 8 a.m. until 6 p.m., Monday, August 26 through Friday, September 13, excluding Saturday, August 31 through Monday, September 2, for intersection reconstruction
- Motorists traveling northbound on SR 5/Federal Highway will be detoured via 5th Avenue South, South M Street and 2nd Avenue South
- Motorists traveling southbound on SR 5/Federal Highway will be detoured via 2nd Avenue South, Ocean Breeze, and 5th Avenue South



PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Milling and resurfacing the existing roadway to ensure long-term resilience
- Adding drainage and constructing a raised intersection at 7th Avenue South for storm water resiliency and motorist safety
- Upgrading pedestrian curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards
- Installing signalized pedestrian crossings with Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB's) at 8th Avenue South, 3rd Avenue North, and 4th Avenue North to enhance safety for pedestrians
- Removing the existing midblock crossing between 4th
 Avenue North and 5th Avenue North to allow space for additional pedestrian crossings
- Upgrading vehicular and pedestrian signalization at 6th Avenue South and 2nd Avenue North to enhance motorist and pedestrian safety
- Installing lighting at the intersections of 8th Avenue South, 6th Avenue South, 2nd Avenue North, 3rd Avenue North, and 4th Avenue North for enhanced visibility and safety for pedestrians and motorists.
- Upgrading signage and pavement markings for shared bicycle facilities and buffered bicycle lanes to improve bicyclist safety
