


A YEAR IN REVIEW

- In 2017, the North Carolina General Assembly approved \$3.5 million for the Smart Start Network to distribute books through the **Dolly Parton Imagination Library**. We were allocated \$8000 in Union County and proud of the 1862 children, birth to age 5, whom we are helping build a home library.
- We organized and collaborated with many local agencies for **ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act)** to strengthen the birth through third grade continuum and strategize to improve third grade reading proficiency.
- We received a grant from the NC Early Childhood Foundation for **Pathways to Grade Level Reading** to convene a network of professional partners in two workshops. Partners worked to narrow the causes and find solutions to obtaining grade level reading by third grade and make recommendations to the NC Pathways Design Team for state leaders and policy makers.
- All 14 of our Early Childhood Programs met or exceeded reporting standards based on program guidelines.
- We received a \$40,000 grant to help continue serving teens and children in the Best Start Program.
- The **NC Legislature** recognized the work we are doing and designated an additional \$25,000 in February to our partnership to be used in the fiscal year 2018.
- We were the recipient of over 1000 **PetSmart** stuffed animals and we used them as reading buddies to promote reading in the early childcare community.
- Thanks to our Board of Directors we moved to our new office in September and hosted an open house and ribbon cutting in early February.
- We celebrated our 20th anniversary of serving children in Union County.
