

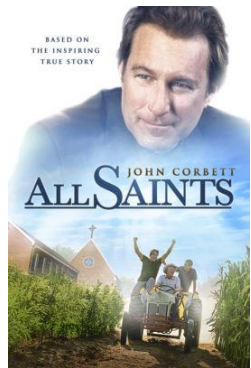
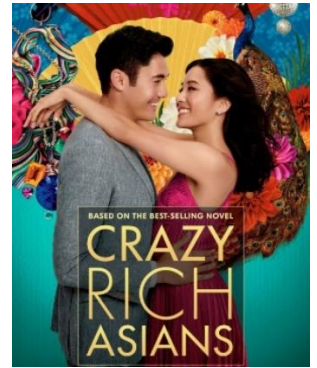
Movie Night Schedule

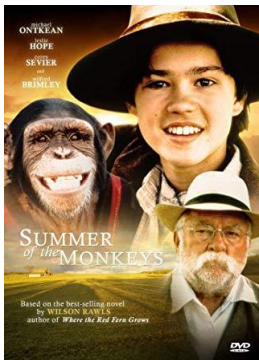
5:30 Dinner-Pizza (\$6.00 per person)

6:00 Movie: *Ralph Breaks the Internet* (PG)

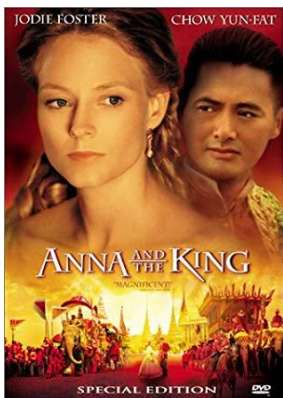
