<sup>3-4</sup> Every time I say your name in prayer—which is practically all the time—I thank God for you, the God I worship with my whole life in the tradition of my ancestors. I miss you a lot, especially when I remember that last tearful good-bye, and I look forward to a joy-packed reunion.

<sup>5-7</sup> That precious memory triggers another: your honest faith—and what a rich faith it is, handed down from your grandmother Lois to your mother Eunice, and now to you! And the special gift of ministry you received when I laid hands on you and prayed—keep that ablaze! God doesn’t want us to be shy with his gifts, but bold and loving and sensible.

<sup>8-10</sup> So don’t be embarrassed to speak up for our Master or for me, his prisoner. Take your share of suffering for the Message along with the rest of us. We can only keep on going, after all, by the power of God, who first saved us and then called us to this holy work. We had nothing to do with it. It was all his idea, a gift prepared for us in Jesus long before we knew anything about it. But we know it now. Since the appearance of our Savior, nothing could be plainer: death defeated, life vindicated in a steady blaze of light, all through the work of Jesus.

<sup>11-12</sup> This is the Message I’ve been set apart to proclaim as preacher, emissary, and teacher. It’s also the cause of all this trouble I’m in. But I have no regrets. I couldn’t be more sure of my ground—the One I’ve trusted in can take care of what he’s trusted me to do right to the end.

<sup>13-14</sup> So keep at your work, this faith and love rooted in Christ, exactly as I set it out for you. It’s as sound as the day you first heard it from me. Guard this precious thing placed in your custody by the Holy Spirit who works in us.

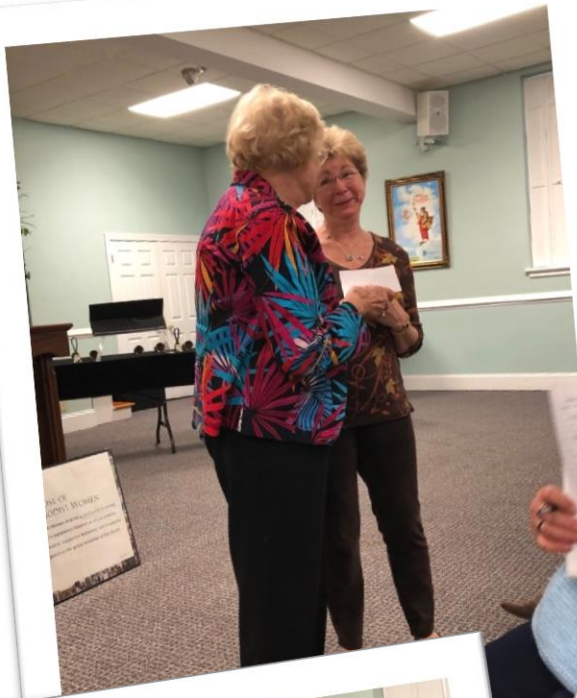

## No Such Thing as Church Revitalization

Churches in decline or in need of renewal often seek “revitalization” in an attempt to return to their former glory. But many things that initially contributed to growth, including cultural norms, socio-economic conditions, and the population in the neighborhood, no longer exist. Real renewal comes from rediscovering their mission, reengaging their mission field, and refocusing their resources to support the mission, not from trying to revive the past. Rediscovering, reengaging, and refocusing a congregation is equivalent to rewriting the DNA of the congregation. These steps are essential:

**Acknowledge the loss** ~ When a church has been in decline for several years, the congregation must complete all stages of grief before beginning a plan to engage the future. Wanting to again experience a vibrant and healthy church and wondering each week who will show up takes a significant emotional toll on a congregation. Allow the church to grieve. It will save a lot of frustration.

**Adopt a missionary mindset** ~ The people groups in our neighborhoods have significantly changed in past decades. There is no longer one dominant culture that pervades most of our urban and suburban neighborhoods. To reach people who are far from God and who now live in our neighborhoods will require a missionary mindset, beginning with intercultural competency.

**Build a team** ~ Leading a congregation through the process of rediscovering, reengaging, and refocusing should not be influenced by the pastor alone. The expectation that a new pastor with new ideas for church revitalization is the solution for a congregation is unrealistic. A church needs 5-7 influential and confident women and men who can look at ministry context and a ministry action plan and who can implement changes strategically as a team.

**Pray** ~ Prayer is the most critical component of a church rediscovering, reengaging, and refocusing on their mission. Do not trust that a golden nugget such as a great book on strategy, church consultant, ministry coach, webinar, podcast, or conference will get the church unstuck, renewed, revitalized, and healthy. Unless there is prayer movement within the church, no strategy, consultant, coach, book, or podcast will do much good.

**Consider new possibilities** ~ Some congregations will need to consider these possibilities to offer new life in new forms.

**Adoption:** This is when the existing church and a new church partner to take on the identity of the new church over time. There is a time of shared leadership and a predetermined time to hand over the leadership and branding to the new congregation. **Vital Merger:** This is when two

churches agree that their missions align with each other and that both will eventually close without significant change. Both churches sell their properties, release their pastors, and agree on a new pastor to lead them into a new ministry context.

### **Bishops briefed on funding crisis**

United Methodist bishops received a sobering message during their autumn meeting. Without any changes, the fund that supports their work will run out of money in five years. "Something else is going to have to happen for us to be able to balance the budget," said Rick King, chief financial officer of the denomination's General Council on Finance and Administration. "The reserves, at the current collection rate, are essentially gone by the end of 2024." The United Methodist Church currently has 66 active bishops supported by the denomination's Episcopal Fund. Giving to the general church, King said, is down across the board. The denomination's annual conferences — church regional bodies — are each asked to pay apportionments that support the ministries of the general church. The conferences in turn ask for apportionments from local churches. General church apportionments go to seven funds that support bishops, ministerial education, most general agencies, general administration, and denomination-wide efforts such as the Black College Fund and Africa University in Zimbabwe. Overall, the seven general funds have received about \$7.8 million less through October than they had at the same point in 2018. The Episcopal Fund alone is down about \$1.1 million compared to the same time last year, he said. ~ **UM News Service**
