Spiritual Practices

You should have received your letter from Pastor Candee and the Worship Committee that includes some resources for you to engage in daily prayer and Bible reading, including a **Lenten devotional booklet**. If you are used to the idea that Lent means fasting or giving up some kind of food, it may help you to know that while that is one kind of spiritual practice, there are also other options to help focus your attention on God during this season.

- You could **give up something other than food**, something that takes your time, energy, or attention but is not truly necessary. Some people fast from television, social media, shopping, gossip, staying up late, or worrying.
- You could **take on a daily or weekly practice**, such as reading the Bible, praying (or if you pray every day already, it could be a different form of prayer or praying for longer than usual), volunteering, calling people who might be lonely, sending cards to military servicemembers or people in prison, writing letters to elected officials about your values, giving money or needed goods to charitable organizations (such as food for a food pantry, socks for people who are homeless, or school supplies for low-income families - for greatest impact, contact the organization first to find out what they need most).
- You could find a way to **focus your attention and connect with God's presence in something you already do**, from washing dishes to walking the dog, gardening to caring for children to reading the newspaper. Any repeated action can become a spiritual practice with the intention of doing it as prayer and paying attention to how God might be speaking to you.

And if you are in a place where adding one more thing - or giving something up - feels like too much right now, rest assured, **God loves and accepts you**, is present with you, and understands the demands on your life. We are all living with more stress than usual because of the circumstances of the COVID-19 pandemic. **These practices are for our benefit**, not to satisfy a God who demands more than we can give.

Lenten Study: A Disciple's Path

Pastor Candee and I invite you to take part in this year's Lenten study, using the materials in **A Disciple's Path**, by **James Harnish and Justin LaRosa**. In this study based on Scripture and the Wesleyan theological tradition, we will explore what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ, broken out by the commitments included in the United Methodist Church's membership vows: Prayers (and Scripture study), Presence in Worship and Small Groups, Gifts, Service, and Witness.

We will meet **Wednesday evenings at 7:00 p.m., from February 24 to March 31**. The official session will begin at 7:00, but the Zoom meeting will open at 6:30 pm for those who want some time for fellowship before we dive into the material.

This study includes **daily readings and reflection exercises in a workbook, five days each week**. This level of commitment may seem high, but the rewards are great: the study will help you develop spiritual practices, discover your unique gifts, and engage in ministry that brings transformation to your own life and to the lives of others and the world.
