The theme of this year's retreat was *Living Our Faith in a Secular World – What We Can Learn From the Prophet Jeremiah*. Chris Parker, the originator of the retreat, welcomed everyone and said a few words about the history of the retreat and stated the purpose of the retreat was to Remember, Refresh, Reset, Renew, Relax, and Retreat.

Over 500,000 pounds of food has been distributed in our Diocese, including almost 265,000 pounds in the Winston-Salem/Greensboro areas. This effort helped over 10,000 Men, women and children, including 1,450 families in our area. As it becomes more difficult to acquire additional food, especially during this inflationary period, the Agency is working overtime to assure that every family needing food or other services is able to receive them.

Mental health, Senior, Refugee and other programs are checking on their patients, assisting them with access to information and resources, applying for appropriate benefits, and ensuring that children are completing school assignments and doing well emotionally.

Veteran Services case coordinators continue to ensure that Veterans are stable. Catholic Charities is also providing supportive services specifically to very low-income veterans their families at risk of homelessness, with the ultimate goal of ending homelessness among our veterans.

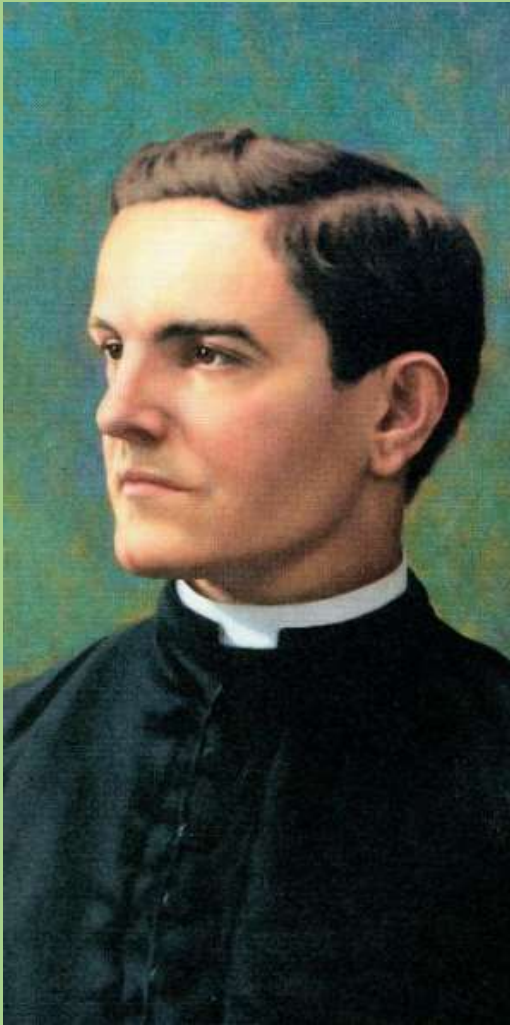
