
### FEED THE BEAST



State Law prohibits consuming of alcoholic beverages

The Boxes are being placed in the Narthex, and I invite all of you to make a run to the grocery store to help supply food for the 125 Families that we will be serving this year. Note that this includes 25 families from our own Parish.

Before I sign off, I want to highlight a program that is struggling a bit with support from the Council. Adopt A Highway, which is chaired by Jim Nesbitt, needs YOU. In recent years some of the long-standing regulars have fallen away due to health and other issues. Jim and a small group of individuals take an hour out of their Saturday morning several times a year to clean up all the miscellaneous trash that is dumped along Kinammon Road. It's not glamorous, but it is necessary, and it requires our attention. As I mentioned above, we are strongest when we are together as a group and many hands make for light work. Please consider joining Jim at 8am on Saturday, October 11<sup>th</sup> at the Church.

As always, thank you for your unwavering support of me and this Council. I look forward to seeing all of you in the coming days.

Catholic Charities has an ongoing need for financial support. This need is exemplified by some of the following information.

Over 500,000 pounds of food has been distributed in our Diocese, including almost 265,000 pounds in the Winston-Salem/Greensboro areas. This effort helped over 10,000 Men, women and children, including 1,450 families in our area. As it becomes more difficult to acquire additional food, especially during this inflationary period, the Agency is working overtime to assure that every family needing food or other services is able to receive them.

Mental health, Senior, Refugee and other programs are checking on their patients, assisting them with access to information and resources, applying for appropriate benefits, and ensuring that children are completing school assignments and doing well emotionally.

Veteran Services case coordinators continue to ensure that Veterans are stable. Catholic Charities is also providing supportive services specifically to very low-income veterans their families at risk of homelessness, with the ultimate goal of ending homelessness among our veterans.

# Pope Leo's October prayer intention: Collaboration between different religious traditions

Pope Leo XIV's monthly prayer intention for October is for "collaboration between different religious traditions."

The Pope invited the Church to pray for this intention in this month's The Pope Video, which is entrusted to the entire Catholic Church through the <u>Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network</u>. Specifically, the Video opens with his voice inviting faithful to join in praying that believers in different religious traditions might work together to defend and promote peace, justice and human fraternity.

"Lord Jesus," the Pope's prayer begins, "You, who in diversity are one and look lovingly at every person, help us to recognize ourselves as brothers and sisters, called to live, pray, work, and dream together."

He acknowledges that despite being "a world full of beauty," it is "also wounded by deep divisions," where "sometimes," he lamented, "religions, instead of uniting us, become a cause of confrontation."

Hence, he implores, "Give us your Spirit to purify our hearts, so that we may recognize what unites us and, from there, learn again how to listen and collaborate without destroying."

The Holy Father went on to pray that the concrete examples of peace, justice and fraternity in religions inspire us to believe that it is possible to live and work together, beyond our differences.

"May religions not be used as weapons or walls, but rather lived as bridges and prophecy: making the dream of the common good credible, accompanying life, sustaining hope and being the yeast of unity in a fragmented world. Amen," Pope Leo concludes.


