As we begin to think more strategically about the sustainability of ICCAMP and our efforts to broadly establish the **Annual Day of Commemoration for African Ancestors Who Perished in the Middle Passage** on the second weekend in June, we would like you to share further news about ICCAAMP's efforts to extend our reach.

ICCAAMP has joined in partnership with the **400 Year Commission** to observe **"LET'S TALK": The International Day of Drumming and Healing, June 19, 2019**. The Commission references the first enslaved Africans' from Angola arrival at Ft. Comfort, Virginia, in 1619. This commemorative day will focus on healing and reeducation among Africans in the Western Diaspora and beyond. It will mourn the terror and trauma endured by African descendants over those four centuries occasioned by: The Transatlantic slave trade; forced family dissolution; centuries of degradation based on race (e.g., slavery, peonage, lynching, Jim Crow, and structural racism); a myriad socioeconomic disparities; and now mass incarceration.

ICCAAMP members in Washington, D.C, San Francisco, Nigeria and Cameroon will participate in the June 19th program. Details about specific programs are forthcoming.
