OUR PROGRAMMATIC STRATEGY

The Girls Inc. Experience is the difference-maker in impacts for girls. It puts the Girls Inc. mission into action and equips girls to navigate gender economic, and social barriers to grow into healthy, educated, and independent adults. People, environment, and programming underpin the framework of Girls Inc. Experience, allowing girls to learn about themselves and their values, to challenge each other to think critically about their world, and to create and maintain positive peer and adult relationships through a sisterhood of support. Characterized by **Six Essential Elements** of positive girls' development, these elements provide a holistic approach that is grounded in a belief of the rights and abilities of every girl.



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Similar to the rest of the country, 2020 looked very different than what we originally anticipated. As the country shut down, we refused to give up on our girls! Girls Inc. of Greater Houston quickly pivoted from our normal in-school/after-school programming to a virtual platform. Because of the hard work of our very dedicated staff, we were able to quickly shift to online programming to keep our girls engaged as well as check on their well-being.

We continued reaching the girls virtually during the summer so we could continue providing the same quality programming that Girls Inc. of Greater Houston is known for.

In July we held our Be Bold Institute for high school girls featuring some amazing partners, and then moved right into our Camp Smart for our younger girls. We also collaborated with the YMCA and other area agencies to bring our girls Imagine Science.




