We welcome Rev. Marty Phillips as our guest minister today during Pastor Donna's absence.

MUSIC NOTES: The Sanctus text comes from Isaiah 6:3, and is directly inspired by Isaiah's vision of God's glory. Its use in Christian prayer is very ancient and might even have entered directly into Christianity from the practice of the synagogue. In the fifth century it became part of the Eucharistic Prayer in liturgy. It has two parts, the Sanctus, which we sing today, and the Benedictus which translates "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest." The text focuses on two aspects of God: the awe of God's majesty and the humility of Jesus.

The Requiem in D minor, Op. 48, was composed by Gabriel Fauré between 1897 and 1900. A Requiem Mass is a mass for the dead. Fauré's reasons for its composition are unclear. Its focus is on eternal rest and consolation.

On Good Friday, April 18, our chancel choir will join with the choir of Providence Presbyterian to offer a worship service incorporating this beautiful work.
