LAST TIME OUT: The Fisher Cats dropped their first game of the series, 7-4, to Hartford despite outhitting the Yard Goats, 10-6. New Hampshire left 10 runners on base, their most in a game since July 30 at Binghamton. **Sean Mellen** was perfect through three innings in his fourth spot-start, and he finished with a season-high 3.2 IP, allowing one hit and one earned run. He had a season-high seven strikeouts. **Luis De Los Santos** had singles in his first three at bats and scored on **Ryan Gold's** sacrifice fly in the fourth. The Fisher Cats led, 2-1, going into the bottom of the fifth, and Hartford added three runs on no hits in the frame to take their first lead of the series. The Yard Goats stretched the lead to 6-2 in the sixth. **Addison Barger's** two-run homer in the ninth was not enough.

WHO'S HOT: **John Aiello** has an active 20-game on-base streak, in which he is 27-for-74 (.364) with six doubles, one homer and seven RBIs. Aiello's streak is the longest by a Fisher Cat this season and is the third-longest active streak in the league. **Davis Schneider** returned from the development list on August 10, and he has hits in seven straight games since (10-for-28, .357). Schneider had three straight games with a RBI to end the Erie series, including a RBI triple on Sunday. **Sebastian Espino** is hitting .265 since returning from the development list on July 30. He has a .293 average with four multi-hit games this month.

TIEDEMAN IN THE HOUSE: Blue Jays No. 2 prospect, and No. 34 overall prospect, Tariq "Ricky" Tiedemann joined NH on June 5. Across two starts with NH, he's thrown 5.0 innings and given up three earned runs with seven Ks. The 20-year-old, 6-foot-4 lefty pitched a perfect inning in the Sirius XM All-Star Futures Game at Dodger Stadium. Across Single-A Dunedin and High-A Vancouver, Tiedemann had a 2.39 ERA in 14 starts with 103 Ks and 13.7 K/9. He had 6+ strikeouts in 13 of his first 14 starts this year, striking out a career-high 10 on May 13 vs. Tampa (Yankees Single-A). He is the youngest player in the league and second-youngest in all of Double-A.

ORELVIS' BOMBS: **Orelvis Martinez** is tied for the home run crown in the Fisher Cats history books, hitting a team-record 27 home runs this season in 391 plate appearances. Chip Cannon had the same total in 2006 in 524 plate appearances, and Eric Thames had 27 in 2010 in 560 plate appearances. He's second in the league in homers behind Erie's Quincy Nieporte (28), and Martinez had his fourth two-homer game of the season last night at Dunkin' Donuts Park. At age 20, Martinez is the youngest of the seven players with 20+ home runs in the Eastern League. The second youngest is 21-year-old Ronny Mauricio (Binghamton, 22 HR).

RYAN IS GOLDEN: Catcher **Ryan Gold** had one of the best hitting nights of his career on Wednesday, going 4-for-5 with a single, triple, two two-run homers and six RBIs. His four hits tied a career-high, and his six RBIs was one off his career-high. Gold hit for the cycle for the Lansing Lugnuts on April 28, 2019 against the Dayton Dragons. He had seven RBIs in that game. Gold's two big flies made him the third Fisher Cat to have two homers in a game this season (**Sebastian Espino, Orelvis Martinez**). Wednesday was Gold's first two-homer game of his career.

AGAINST THE YARD GOATS: New Hampshire has had Hartford's number this year, going 9-6 against the Yard Goats. The Fisher Cats won their first series of the year over Hartford, 4-2, back on April 12-17. The two teams split their second series at Delta Dental Stadium in July. New Hampshire has hit .275 with 32 homers versus Hartford, while the Yard Goats are hitting .220 with 18 homers against NH. **Ryan Gold** is 11-for-24 with four homers against the Goats, and **Zac Cook** has six of his 13 homers against Hartford, **Jimmy Burnette** (4.1 IP) and **Jake Elliott** (4.2 IP) have yet to give up an earned run to the Yard Goats.

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** has broken the New Hampshire single-season record for hit by pitches with 26. Eric Thames was hit by 18 pitches in 2010, but that was in 573 plate appearances over 130 games. Cook's first 18 hit by pitches came in 139 plate appearances and 36 games. Cook is second in HBP in all the minors, behind Braiden Ward of the Rockies system (31). As far as stats go to 1988, the record for HBP in a season in the minors is 41 (2012). His 26 HBP rank third in Eastern League history.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: August 19, 2018 – The Fisher Cats salvaged the final game of a four-game series at Trenton to extend the lead over the second-place Thunder to 2.5 games. Jordan Romano picked up his 11th win, allowing one earned run in 5.2 innings. Max Pentecost, Jon Berti and Lourdes Gurriel Jr. each hit a home run. Gurriel's came in a seven-run ninth inning as New Hampshire pulled away.

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Jays scored a 9-2 win in the opener of a series at the Yankees. Vladimir Guerrero Jr. hit his 26th homer in a five-run second inning. George Springer went 5-for-5. Jose Berrios improved to 9-5 (6.2 IP – 1 ER – 9 K). Max Castillo lost in his first start for the Royals, despite allowing just one run in 5.0 innings. KC fell, 7-1, at Tampa Bay. Chavez Young homered in the seventh to put Buffalo in a 4-4 tie with Lehigh Valley. The Bisons won the game in the bottom of the eighth. Vinny Capra started the inning with a single, scoring on a sacrifice fly by Stevie Berman.
