LAST TIME OUT: New Hampshire crushed Binghamton, 17-8, last night in a game that had 25 runs, 28 hits and 19 walks. The Fisher Cats fell behind, 2-1, after two innings but scored nine answered, sparked by five runs on four hits in the third. **Addison Barger** was 3-for-5 with a three-run homer, and **Orelvis Martinez** had home runs in his first two at bats. He finished with a season-high five RBIs. **John Aiello** (3-for-5, RBI), **Luis De Los Santos** (3-for-5, RBI) and **Cam Eden** (3-for-6, RBI) all had three hits as well. Eight of the nine starters had a hit, and six finished with multiple hits. **Rafael Lantigua** hit his third homer of the week in the seventh inning. **Yosver Zulueta** picked up the win with 2.0 innings of scoreless relief and four strikeouts.

WHO'S HOT: **Addison Barger** has an active seven-game hit streak and is 20-for-46 (.435) with two doubles, four homers, nine RBIs and seven multi-hit games across his first 12 Double-A starts. **John Aiello** is 8-for-20 with three RBIs and four walks in his last six games. **Luis De Los Santos** had three hits last night and is 7-for-10 with three runs, two doubles, a homer, four RBIs and four walks in the series. He's batting .289 with six homers and 34 RBIs on the road, compared to .234 with two homers and eight RBIs at Delta Dental.

LUCKY NUMBER SEVENTEEN: New Hampshire scored a season-high 17 runs in their 17-8 victory over Binghamton last night. The previous high was 16 in their 16-0 victory over Portland at Hadlock Field on July 1. The Fisher Cats hit four homers last night and have now homered in seven consecutive games. Their season long streak is eight games. **Rafael Lantigua** has homered in three straight starts. Only three players in team history have hit homers in four straight games. The most recent was Ryan Schimpf (August 14-17, 2015).

BARGER'S SCALDING START: Blue Jays sixth-round draft pick **Addison Barger** has made a splash in his first 11 games at Double-A. Barger has hits in 11 of his 12 starts, batting 20-for-46 (.435) with two doubles, four home runs, nine RBIs, five walks and 11 strikeouts. He has seven multi-hit games already and has had a four- and seven-game hit streak. Barger started the season with High-A Vancouver, where he batted .300 with 21 doubles, 14 homers and 53 RBIs in 69 games. Barger was drafted out of King HS in Florida in the 2018 MLB Draft.

KLOFF DELIVERS PUNCHES: Texas native **Adam Kloffenstein** struck out 10 batters last Saturday night against Portland, good for the most strikeouts by a New Hampshire starter this season. Kloffenstein's career-high for punchouts is 11 at Everett on August 10, 2021. In his last three starts, Kloffenstein has a 3.68 ERA, allowing six earned runs in 14.2 innings with seven walks and 17 strikeouts.

THE NEW GUYS: New Hampshire has welcomed six players since returning from the All-Star Break: **RHP Ryan Boyer**, **C Zach Britton**, **RHP Jake Elliott**, **IF Tyler Keenan**, **RHP Alejandro Melean** and **RHP Andrew Moore**. Elliott was received from Triple-A Buffalo and has a 2-0 record and a 3.63 ERA with New Hampshire this year.

TIME TO PONY UP: The Fisher Cats continue their third and final series against Binghamton. New Hampshire is 9-6 against the Rumble Ponies this year, and their lone six-game road series win came at Mirabito Stadium in June. The Fisher Cats are batting .263 against Binghamton this year with 32 doubles and 23 homers. Binghamton is hitting .238 against NH with 22 doubles and 15 homers. **John Aiello** is hitting 15-for-39 (.385) with four doubles and a homer against Binghamton this year.

ORELVIS' BOMBS: Orelvis Martinez had his third two-homer games of the season last night, and he is now leading the Eastern League in home runs with 24. At age 20, Martinez is the youngest of the nine players at Double-A with 20+ home runs. The second youngest is Leandro Cedenio of Amarillo at age 23. Martinez is also on pace to smash the single-season home runs record for the Fisher Cats. Chip Cannon (2006) and Eric Thames (2010) are tied for the crown with 27 in a season. 12 players have hit at least 20 homers in a season for the Fisher Cats, most recently Cavan Biggio with 26 in 2018.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: July 29, 2018 – The Fisher Cats completed a four-game sweep of the Yard Goats in Hartford with an 8-1 win. Eduard Pinto went 2-for-4 with a homer and 4 RBI and Harold Ramirez added a home run. T. J. Zeuch (zoik) worked six scoreless innings to improve to 7-4.

STOP HITTING ME: Zac Cook has broken the New Hampshire single-season record for hit by pitches with 24. Eric Thames was hit by 18 pitches in 2010, but that was in 573 plate appearances over 130 games. Cook's first 18 hit by pitches came in 139 plate appearances and 36 games. Cook is second in HBP in all the minors, behind Braiden Ward of the Colorado Rockies system (28). As far as stats go to 1988, the record for HBP in a season in the minors in 41 (2012). Cook's 24 HBP rank fourth in Eastern League history.

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: Matt Chapman homered twice as Toronto opened a series with Detroit with a 5-3 win. Bo Bichette had a pair of hits and Jordan Romano finished up for his 22nd save. L J Talley drove in Buffalo's only run in a 3-1 loss to Worcester. It was Everett over Vancouver 4-1 in 10 innings. The Canadians had only one hit, a double by Harrison Ray in the eighth inning. He scored what would be the first run of the game after a passed ball and a groundout.

LAST TIME OUT: Struck out 10 batters over five innings in a 5-3 win over the Sea Dogs last Saturday night. Kloffenstein allowed three hits including a three-run homer by Alex Binelas. Left with the Fisher Cats trailing 3-2, so still seeking his first win with the Fisher Cats.

v. BINGHAMTON – Makes his second start against the Rumble Ponies. Pitched at Mirabito Stadium on June 11, allowing four runs in 4.1 innings in New Hampshire's 7-5 win.

2022: Opened season with Adv. A Vancouver, going 0-2 with a 3.81 ERA in six starts. Struck out 30 in 25 IP.

2021: Kloffenstein spent the entire season with Class A Advanced Vancouver, making a career-high 23 starts. He pitched 101.1 innings and had a 7-7 record with a 6.22 ERA. He walked 61 batters and struck out 107.

2019: Had a 4-4 record and a 2.24 ERA with the Vancouver Canadians, who were the Class A short season affiliate of the Blue Jays in 2019. Kloff made 13 starts and threw 64.1 innings, walking 23 and striking out 64. He had a career-best WHIP of 1.09, and opponents hit .204 against him.

2018: Pitched with the GCL Blue Jays at the rookie level. He threw just 2.0 innings across two starts in his rookie season.

Obtained: Kloffenstein was selected in the third round and 88th overall in the 2018 draft. He was drafted out of Magnolia High School, where he was teammates with Blue Jays prospect Jordan Groshans. He was originally committed to play at TCU and received a \$2.45 million signing bonus.

Personal: Ranked the No. 11 prospect in the Toronto system at the beginning of 2022. The slider is Kloffenstein's highest-rated pitch.
