LAST TIME OUT: After losing two of the first three games to Hartford, New Hampshire has rattled off two straight wins to take the edge in the series. Last night, the Fisher Cats held on to win, 5-4, behind a **Paxton Schultz** gem. The righty threw 5.2 innings, allowing just two baserunners. He retired 14 consecutive batters from the first through the sixth. He finished with one walk and four strikeouts. The baserunner **Sean Mellen** inherited from Schultz scored, spoiling Schultz's shutout bid. He was one out away from a quality start. At the plate, **Zac Cook**, **Ryan Gold** and **Chris Bec** homered, driving in all five of New Hampshire's runs. **Sean Rackoski** got a one-out save, striking out Isaac Collins with the tying run on second base.

WHO'S HOT: **Ryan Gold** has his longest hit streak of the year, currently at seven games. In that stretch, Gold is 8-for-22 (.364) with one double, two homers, five RBIs and four walks. **Luis De Los Santos** has a five-game hit streak in which he's 5-for-18 (.278). **Rafael Lantigua** hammered his first home run of the season on Wednesday, too, after being robbed of a homer by Cedanne Rafaela at Portland last week. In his last 12 games, Lantigua is 16-for-52 (.307) with five doubles, a homer and nine RBIs. On Wednesday, **Orelvis Martinez** had the second two-homer day for a Fisher Cat this season (**Sebastian Espino**, May 12 vs. Binghamton). **Trevor Schwecke** is batting 11-for-34 (.324) with three doubles, one triple, one homer and 10 RBIs in July.

K-CITY: Fisher Cats pitching has totaled 66 strikeouts over the last six games, tied with Tulsa for the second-most in Double-A. New Hampshire has struck out at least 10 batters in seven of the last eight games. The staff punched out a season-high 17 batters in a 3-1 loss to Hartford on Thursday night. **Yosver Zulueta** (8), **Braden Scott** (5), **Parker Caracci** (4), **Sean Mellen** (4) and **Thomas Ruwe** (T-4) have all notched Double-A season-highs for strikeouts in a game this week.

ORELVIS' BOMBS: Orelvis Martinez is tied for third in the Eastern League in homers with 19. More notably, he's on pace to set the single-season home runs record for the Fisher Cats. Chip Cannon (2006) and Eric Thames (2010) are tied for the crown with 27 in a season. 12 players have hit at least 20 homers in a season for the Fisher Cats, most recently Cavan Biggio with 26 in 2018.

SO LONG, SPENCE: First baseman **Spencer Horwitz** was promoted to Triple-A Buffalo on the off-day on Tuesday. Horwitz blasted his first Triple-A homer last night, and he's batting 8-for-19 (.421) in his first five games with the Bisons. The Blue Jays 30th ranked prospect (MLB.com) hit .370 in June with 30 hits, nine doubles, five homers and 19 walks. His batting average last month was fourth in all of Double-A, and he had a .490 OBP and a 1.157 OPS in June as well. He was named Eastern League Player of the Week on June 13.

STARTING (AND FINISHING) STRONG: The two innings in which the Fisher Cats have scored the most runs this year are the first (59) and the ninth (49). New Hampshire is batting .295 in the first inning, the third-best clip in Double-A. Their 15 first-inning homers rank second in Double-A behind the Tennessee Smokies (Chicago Cubs, 19). **John Aiello** is 7-for-20 (.350) with two doubles and three walks in the first this season. **Rafael Lantigua** is 16-for-55 (.291) with four doubles in first innings this season. **Luis De Los Santos** is a stunning 11-for-20 (.550) with three doubles, one triple, one homer and eight RBIs in the ninth.

PARKER'S HOUSE: Reliever **Parker Caracci** has been nearly untouchable in his last eight outings. Since giving up seven runs in the ninth inning against Somerset on June 16, Caracci has spun 10.2 scoreless frames. In that span, he's allowed six hits, walked one, and struck out 16. Caracci is a product of Ole Miss, who captured the 2022 national championship. Caracci ranks fifth all-time in program history in saves with 21.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: July 10, 2005 – Casey Janssen worked seven innings, allowing just

two hits, in the Fisher Cats 4-0 win over the Sea Dogs. Janssen did not walk a batter and struck out eight. Three relievers combined to finish the shutout. Against knuckleballer Charlie Zink, Clint Johnston doubled in the first for a 1-0 lead. Chip Cannon hit a two-run homer in the second inning and Rob Cosby homered in the eighth.

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** has broken the New Hampshire single-season record for hit by pitches with 22. Eric Thames was hit by 18 pitches in 2010, but that was in 573 plate appearances over 130 games. Cook's first 18 hit by pitches came in 139 plate appearances and 36 games. Cook is third in HBP in all of the minors, behind Braiden Ward of the Colorado Rockies system (25) and Esteury Ruiz of the Padres system (23). As far as stats date to 2005, the record for hit by pitches in a season in the minors in 41 (2012 and 2017).

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: Spencer Horwitz went 3-for-4 with a double and his first Triple-A homer, but the Bisons lost 4-2 to the Syracuse Mets. Thomas Hatch started for Buffalo, and went five scoreless innings. Starter Zach Logue went five innings, allowing two runs, as Oakland held off Houston 3-2. Logue improved to 3-4. Fisher Cat alum Zach Jackson worked in relief for the A's in that game. He's made 36 appearances out of the Oakland pen, and is holding opponents to a .177 average against. Harold Ramirez had three doubles and three RBI for Tampa Bay, but the Rays dropped a second straight extra inning game in Cincinnati 5-4 in 10.

LAST TIME OUT: Took the loss in the series opener on July 4 against the Yard Goats, allowing six earned runs in 4.0 innings. Allowed five runs in the first, but settled down after that.

v. HARTFORD – Last Monday's start was his first against the Yard Goats.

2022: Opened season with Adv. A Vancouver, going 0-2 with a 3.81 ERA in six starts. Struck out 30 in 25 IP.

2021: Kloffenstein spent the entire season with Class A Advanced Vancouver, making a career-high 23 starts. He pitched 101.1 innings and had a 7-7 record with a 6.22 ERA. He walked 61 batters and struck out 107.

2019: Had a 4-4 record and a 2.24 ERA with the Vancouver Canadians, who were the Class A short season affiliate of the Blue Jays in 2019. Kloff made 13 starts and threw 64.1 innings, walking 23 and striking out 64. He had a career-best WHIP of 1.09, and opponents hit .204 against him.

2018: Pitched with the GCL Blue Jays at the rookie level. He threw just 2.0 innings across two starts in his rookie season.

Obtained: Kloffenstein was selected in the third round and 88th overall in the 2018 draft. He was drafted out of Magnolia High School, where he was teammates with Blue Jays prospect Jordan Groshans. He was originally committed to play at TCU and received a \$2.45 million signing bonus.

Personal: Ranked the No. 11 prospect in the Toronto system at the beginning of 2022. The slider is Kloffenstein's highest-rated pitch.
