LAST TIME OUT: The Fisher Cats gave up five early runs against the Portland Sea Dogs yesterday and lost, 9-4, in their fourth straight defeat and second of the series. Nick Northcut had a three-run blast in the second inning, and Christian Koss drove in another two runs in the inning with a single. Fisher Cats starter Alejandro Melean (L, 0-3) got the hook before the frame was over. Davis Schneider tripled off Portland starter Sterling Sharp in the third to score Cam Eden from first and get New Hampshire on the board. After an Izzy Wilson homer in the fifth made it 8-1, Luis De Los Santos cracked a line drive solo homer to start the bottom of the seventh. Cam Eden added a sacrifice fly four batters later, and Schneider picked up a second RBI with a single. New Hampshire's scoring stopped there, and Portland's win evened the seasons series, 10-10. Brady Lail had six strikeouts in relief.

WHO'S HOT: John Aiello has an active 24-game on-base streak, in which he is 33-for-86 (.384) with seven doubles, three homers and 11 RBIs. Aiello's streak is the longest by a Fisher Cat this season and is the longest active streak in the league. **Davis Schneider** has an active 18-game on-base streak with hits in 16 of them. In that stretch, he's 26-for-73 (.356) with two homers and 12 RBIs. **Luis De Los Santos** finished 23-for-85 (.270) in August and had more hits than any other Fisher Cat in the month. He rides a five-game hit streak into tonight. **Paxton Schultz** has tallied a 3-1 record and 1.83 ERA in his last 10 outings (seven starts).

A WHOLE LOTTA HOMERS: The Fisher Cats are up to 146 home runs in 2022, a new single-season team record. The previous high was 144 by the 2007 team. Even more remarkable, the Fisher Cats broke the record in 1,000 fewer at bats (3,877 AB for 145 HR in 2022, 4,877 AB for 144 HR in 2007). New Hampshire also has the most road home runs in a season with 78, surpassing their previous high of 72 in 2011. The most Fisher Cats home runs at Delta Dental Stadium came in 2007, when they hit 79. New Hampshire currently has 68 homers at home.

ORELVIS IS KING: **Orelvis Martinez** broke the Fisher Cats single season home run record on August 21 with a seventh inning, two-run blast at Dunkin' Donuts Park, his 28th long ball of the season. Chip Cannon (2006) and Eric Thames (2010) each had 27 homers. Thames needed 560 plate appearances, Cannon needed 524 PA, and Martinez needed 391 PA to reach 27 dingers. Martinez has four two-homers games this season, and he's tied for the league lead in homers with Erie's Quincy Nieporte. At age 20, Martinez is the youngest of the nine players with 20+ home runs in the Eastern League. The second youngest is 21-year-old Ronny Mauricio (Binghamton, 24 HR).

RICKY ON THE SHELF: The Toronto Blue Jays moved No. 2 prospect **Ricky Tiedemann** to the development list on Sunday, possibly signaling the end of his game action in 2022. In four starts and 11.0 IP at Double-A, Tiedemann allowed three earned runs, all of which came against Erie. He threw back-to-back scoreless, hitless starts at Hartford and Somerset. Across three levels this year, the 20-year-old struck out 117 batters in 78.2 innings (13.4 K/9) with a 0.86 WHIP. He struck out a season-high 10 batters versus Tampa on May 13 in 5.0 innings.

AGAINST THE SEA DOGS: New Hampshire is 10-10 against Portland this season, and they've won three of their four series. **John Aiello** is 11-for-40 (.275) with five doubles, three homers and six RBIs. In the series, **Paxton Schultz** is 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (three ER, 17.0 IP), and **Andrew Bash** is 3-0 with a 1.42 ERA (three ER, 19.0 IP). David Hamilton is 25-for-66 (.381) with a double, three triples, four homers and 12 RBIs against NH. He is batting .196 against the rest of the league.

STOP HITTING ME: Zac Cook has broken the New Hampshire single-season record for hit by pitches with 27. Eric Thames was hit by 18 pitches in 2010, but that was in 573 plate appearances over 130 games. Cook's first 18 hit by pitches came in 139 plate appearances and 36 games. Cook is second in HBP in all the minors, behind Braiden Ward of the Rockies system (32). As far as stats go to 1988, the record for HBP in a season in the minors in 41 (2012). His 27 HBP rank third in league history. He had just one HBP in August after 26 in April-July.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: September 1, 2019 – Yennsy Diaz earned his 11th win with seven innings of one-hit, one-run ball in New Hampshire's 7-1 win at Hadlock Field over the Sea Dogs. The Fisher Cats scored six times in the top of the fourth, including a lead-off homer by Josh Palacios and a three-run triple by Brock Lundquist.

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Cubs salvaged the final game at Rogers Centre with a 7-5 win last night over the Blue Jays. Cavan Biggio hit a two-run homer. Toronto has the night off before starting a series in Pittsburgh. At 70-59, the Jays are two games ahead of Baltimore for the final wild card spot in the AL. Worcester topped Buffalo, 9-1, last night. Spencer Horwitz had the only extra-base hit for the Bisons: a double. High-A Vancouver came up with a big doubleheader sweep of Spokane, 6-4 and 5-4. Tampa won, 4-3, over Dunedin in 10-innings in the Florida State League.
