LAST TIME OUT: The New Hampshire Fisher Cats fell on Sunday, 10-7, to the Hartford Yard Goats and split their weeklong series, three games a piece. **Adam Kloffenstein** allowed two earned runs in 4.0 innings, both of which came in the first inning. He walked four and struck out five. Hartford scored four in the fifth and four in the seventh to take control. Four Fisher Cats homered: **Cam Eden**, **John Aiello**, **Davis Schneider** and **Zac Cook**. All nine Fisher Cats had hits, and **Phil Clarke** went 2-for-4 with a double in his second game back from the injured list. **Parker Caracci** threw his ninth straight scoreless outing with two strikeouts in 1.2 hitless innings.

WHO'S HOT: **Luis De Los Santos** has a six-game hit streak in which he's 7-for-21 (.333), and he tallied at least one hit in every game of the Hartford series. **Ryan Gold** had his longest hit streak of the year snapped at seven games on a pinch-hit at bat on Sunday. In that stretch, Gold was 8-for-22 (.364) with one double, two homers, five RBIs and four walks. **Phil Clarke** has been scorching hot since returning from the injured list on July 8. He's hit 2-for-4 with a double in two straight games, striking out twice. On Wednesday, **Orelvis Martinez** had the second two-homer day for a Fisher Cat this season (**Sebastian Espino**, May 12 vs. Binghamton). **Trevor Schwecke** is batting 12-for-38 (.316) with three doubles, one triple, one homer and 10 RBIs in July.

K-CITY: Fisher Cats pitching totaled 71 strikeouts over the last six games (7/4-7/12), the most in Double-A over that span. New Hampshire has struck out at least 10 batters in seven of the last nine games. The staff punched out a season-high 17 batters in a 3-1 loss to Hartford on Thursday. **Yosver Zulueta** (8), **Braden Scott** (5), **Parker Caracci** (4), **Sean Mellen** (4) and **Thomas Ruwe** (T-4) all notched Double-A season-highs for Ks last week.

ORELVIS' BOMBS: Orelvis Martinez is tied for third in the Eastern League in homers with 19. More notably, he's on pace to set the single-season home runs record for the Fisher Cats. Chip Cannon (2006) and Eric Thames (2010) are tied for the crown with 27 in a season. 12 players have hit at least 20 homers in a season for the Fisher Cats, most recently Cavan Biggio with 26 in 2018.

LONG TIME, NO SEE: 72 days have passed since the last meeting between New Hampshire and Reading, Double-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies. The Fightins won four of six at Delta Dental Stadium in the series from April 26-May 1. The Fisher Cats hit .239 with seven doubles, five homers, and 23 RBIs against Reading. The Fightin Phils hit .258 with 10 doubles and 10 homers. **John Aiello** (3-for-9) and **Phil Clarke** (4-for-12) both hit .333 in the series.

STARTING (AND FINISHING) STRONG: The two innings in which the Fisher Cats have scored the most runs this year are the first (59) and the ninth (50). New Hampshire is batting .294 in the first inning, the third-best clip in Double-A. Their 15 first-inning homers rank second in Double-A behind the Tennessee Smokies (Chicago Cubs, 19). **John Aiello** is 8-for-21 (.381) with two doubles and three walks in the first this season. **Rafael Lantigua** is 16-for-56 (.262) with four doubles in first innings this season. **Luis De Los Santos** is a stunning 12-for-21 (.571) with three doubles, one triple, one homer and eight RBIs in the ninth.

PARKER'S HOUSE: Reliever **Parker Caracci** has been nearly untouchable in his last nine outings. Since giving up seven runs in the ninth inning against Somerset on June 16, Caracci has spun 12.1 scoreless frames. In that span, he's allowed six hits, walked one, and struck out 18. Caracci is a product of Ole Miss, who captured the 2022 national championship. Caracci ranks fifth all-time in program history in saves with 21.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: July 12, 2010 – The Fisher Cats reached the All-Star Break with a 6-5 win at Binghamton. New Hampshire broke a 3-3 tie with solo home runs by Shane Bowman (BO-min) and Eric Thames in the top of the sixth inning. Two homers by the Mets tied the game, but the Fisher Cats won it in the top of the ninth with an RBI single by Darin Mastroianni (mass-tro-YAH-nee). Darin had a big year in 2010, hitting .301 with 46 stolen bases.

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** has broken the New Hampshire single-season record for hit by pitches with 23. Eric Thames was hit by 18 pitches in 2010, but that was in 573 plate appearances over 130 games. Cook's first 18 hit by pitches came in 139 plate appearances and 36 games. Cook is tied for second in HBP in all the minors, behind Braiden Ward of the Colorado Rockies system (25). Esteury Ruiz of the Padres system also has 23. As far as stats go to 2005, the record for HBP in a season in the minors in 41 (2012 and 2017).

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: Two 2022 Fisher Cats made a splash at higher levels this weekend. **Max Castillo** got his first MLB start, throwing 4.1 innings against Seattle. The Mariners scored three runs, one of which was earned, and Castillo struck out three. **Spencer Horwitz** tore up his first week at Triple-A and was named International League Player of the Week. He hit 9-for-23 (.391) in six games with four doubles, one homer and one RBI. He had a 1.136 OPS for the Bisons. Buffalo has dropped 11 of 13 games but are still just two games out of first place in the International League East.
