LAST TIME OUT: The Fisher Cats dropped their third game of the series, 11-0, to Reading last night at FirstEnergy Stadium. Phillies No. 1 prospect Andrew Painter was terrific, throwing 5.0 shutout innings with nine strikeouts. **Paxton Schultz** (L, 7-6) had seven strikeouts but gave up four earned runs, three of which came with two outs. Reading's McCarthy Tatum and Herbert Iser were a combined 5-for-8 with three doubles, two homers and seven RBIs. They hit back-to-back homers in the seventh. **Cam Eden** had two hits, and **John Aiello** extended his on-base streak to a league-high 29 games with two walks and a single.

WHO'S HOT: **John Aiello** has an active 29-game on-base streak, in which he is 38-for-101 (.376) with eight doubles, four homers and 14 RBIs. Aiello's streak is the longest by a Fisher Cat this season and is tied for the eighth longest in team history. The streak is also the tied for the longest in the Eastern League this year. **Davis Schneider** had his 23-game on-base streak snapped in game two of Wednesday's doubleheader. In that span, Schneider was 31-for-90 (.344) with an eight- and nine-game hit streak. Aiello and Schneider were both promoted this week. **Orelvis Martinez** has his season long hit streak, currently at six games. He has four hits in the series.

SO LONG, JOHNNY: The Blue Jays announced today that **John Aiello** has been promoted to Triple-A Buffalo. At the time of his promotion, he led the team in batting average (.305), on-base percentage (.403), slugging percentage (.476) and OPS (.879) among players with 40+ games played. His OPS ranked fourth in the Eastern League among players with 70+ games played. Aiello reached base in his last 29 Double-A games from July 17 to September 9. The streak is tied for the longest in the Eastern League this season and is tied for the eighth-longest in Fisher Cats history.

A WHOLE LOTTA HOMERS: The Fisher Cats are up to 153 home runs in 2022, a new single-season team record. The previous high was 144 by the 2007 team. Even more remarkable, the Fisher Cats broke the record in 1,000 fewer at bats (3,877 AB for 145 HR in 2022, 4,877 AB for 144 HR in 2007). New Hampshire also has the most road home runs in a season with 82, surpassing their previous high of 72 in 2011. The most Fisher Cats home runs at Delta Dental Stadium came in 2007, when they hit 79. New Hampshire currently has 71 homers at home. Oddly enough, New Hampshire did not have a grand slam through their first 150 homers. Number 151 was an **Addison Barger** grand slam at Reading.

ORELVIS IS KING: **Orelvis Martinez** broke the Fisher Cats single season home run record on August 21 with a seventh inning, two-run blast at Dunkin' Donuts Park, his 28th long ball of the season. Chip Cannon (2006) and Eric Thames (2010) each had 27 homers. Thames needed 560 plate appearances, Cannon needed 524 PA, and Martinez needed 391 PA to reach 27 dingers. Martinez has four two-homers games this season, and he's second in the league in homers behind Erie's Quincy Nieporte (30). At age 20, Martinez is the youngest of the 12 players with 20+ home runs in the Eastern League. The second youngest is 21-year-old Ronny Mauricio (BNG, 24 HR).

AGAINST THE FIGHTINS: New Hampshire is 5-11 against Reading this season, and they've lost both series four games to two. **Addison Barger** is 16-for-36 (.444) with three doubles, a homer and eight RBIs against Reading. He had a grand slam in game one on Wednesday. **John Aiello** is hitting .317 (13-for-41) with one double in the season series. **Gabriel Ponce** has not allowed an earned run in 9.2 innings against the Fightin Phils. Jhailyn Ortiz is 18-for-55 (.327) with six doubles, a triple and a homer against the Fisher Cats this season. New Hampshire is hitting .238 with 11 homers against Reading, while the Fightin Phils are hitting .284 with 17 homers against NH. In 10 of 16 games against Reading, New Hampshire has scored two runs or fewer. They've been shut out five times.

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** has broken the New Hampshire single-season record for hit by pitches with 29.

Eric Thames was hit by 18 pitches in 2010, but that was in 573 plate appearances over 130 games. Cook's first 18 hit by pitches came in 139 plate appearances and 36 games. Cook is second in HBP in all the minors, behind Braiden Ward of the Rockies system (33). His 28 HBP rank second in league history dating back to 1988. He had just one HBP in August after 26 in April-July.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: September 10, 2011 – The Fisher Cats took a 2-1 series lead over Reading in the Divisional Series with a 1-0 win at FirstEnergy Stadium. The game's only run scored in the top of the fifth. Mike McDade singled, Kevin Howard singled, and Danny Perales (purr-AH-liss) hit a sacrifice fly. Drew Hutchison went the first six innings, allowing only two hits. Bobby Korecky finished up for the save. New Hampshire would win the series the next night, 4-2, in Reading.

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: Danny Jansen drove in Raimel Tapia with a single in the top of the ninth to lift the Blue Jays to a 4-3 win over Texas last night. Tim Mayza (W, 6-0) earned the win, and Jordan Romano (S, 32) the save. Bo Bichette hit his 23rd homer in the third inning and also added a triple. At Triple-A, Gwinnett and Buffalo split a pair. The Bisons won, 3-1, in the first game thanks to LJ Talley's two-run jack in the fourth. Sean Rackoski won in relief with Hayden Juenger picking up the save. The Stripers took the nightcap, 4-3. Davis Schneider had hits in both games, including an RBI double in the second game. Buffalo is 5.5 out of first with 18 games to play.
