LAST TIME OUT: The Fisher Cats took their second straight game over Somerset, 5-1, thanks to another night of stellar pitching and timely hits. **Ricky Tiedemann** tossed 3.0 innings in his second straight scoreless, hitless start. He walked two and struck out two. **Jol Concepcion** threw a scoreless inning in his Double-A debut, and **Paxton Schultz** got the win with 5.0 innings of relief and seven strikeouts. **Addison Barger** and **Zach Britton** each drove in a pair of runs. **Davis Schneider** continued his hot stretch with a hit and a RBI. New Hampshire had a season-high five stolen bases, with three by **Zac Cook**.

WHO'S HOT: **John Aiello** has an active 24-game on-base streak, in which he is 33-for-86 (.384) with seven doubles, three homers and 11 RBIs. Aiello's streak is the longest by a Fisher Cat this season and is the longest active streak in the league. **Davis Schneider** had his best week of the season at Hartford, going 11-for-25 with three doubles, a triple, one long ball, one RBI and three stolen bases. He has hits in 12 of his last 14 games. **Sebastian Espino** is hitting .293 in August with three homers, 10 RBIs and five multi-hit games. Espino is now hitting above .200 for the first time since April 27.

SO EXTRA: After Thursday night's 10-inning win, New Hampshire is now 5-1 in extras. The 4-3 win was just the second game in the second half in which New Hampshire played extras, with the first being a 5-4 loss in 10 innings at Portland on June 28. The Fisher Cats have reached the 11th inning just once, in a 7-3 win at Erie on May 22.

LET'S TALK ABOUT STRIKEOUTS: New Hampshire's 20 strikeouts on Thursday night matched their most in a game in team history, with the first coming on May 20 at Erie in a nine-inning game. Matt Sauer's 17 strikeouts were the most ever by a pitcher against NH. The previous high was 13 by New Britain's Matt Garza in 2006.

ORELVIS IS KING: **Orelvis Martinez** broke the Fisher Cats single season home run record last Sunday with a seventh inning, two-run blast at Dunkin' Donuts Park, his 28th long ball of the season. Chip Cannon (2006) and Eric Thames (2010) each had 27 homers. Thames needed 560 plate appearances, Cannon needed 524, and Martinez needed 391 PA to reach 27 dingers. Martinez has four two-homers games this season, and he's tied for the league lead in homers with Erie's Quincy Nieporte. At age 20, Martinez is the youngest of the nine players with 20+ home runs in the Eastern League. The second youngest is 21-year-old Ronny Mauricio (Binghamton, 23 HR).

A WHOLE LOTTA HOMERS: The Fisher Cats have hit a total of 143 home runs this season, one away from tying their all-time season high of 144 (2007). New Hampshire already has the most road home runs in a season with 77, surpassing their previous high of 72 in 2011. The most Fisher Cats home runs at Delta Dental Stadium came in 2007, when they hit 79. New Hampshire currently has 66 homers at home.

THE YOUNG GUNS: New Hampshire has an average age of 24.13 years old amongst its active roster, making the team the second-youngest in the Eastern League (behind Altoona) and third-youngest in Double-A. Four of the team's six starters this week are age 22 or younger. **Ricky Tiedemann** is the youngest player in the Eastern League and the second-youngest in Double-A, having turned 20 years old last Thursday. **Sem Robberse** and **Orelvis Martinez**, the Blue Jays No. 7 and No. 3 prospects, are both age 20, too. **Alejandro Melean** and **Adam Kloffenstein** are ages 21 and 22, respectively.

AGAINST THE PATRIOTS: New Hampshire is 5-11 against Somerset this season and has lost both series. The Fisher Cats have hit .193 with 16 homers. Somerset has hit .212 against New Hampshire with 14 homers. Also, Somerset is 24-for-27 on stolen base attempts against NH. **Will Robertson** leads the active roster with a .250 average and seven RBIs against Somerset.

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** has broken the New Hampshire single-season record for hit by pitches with 27.

Eric Thames was hit by 18 pitches in 2010, but that was in 573 plate appearances over 130 games. Cook's first 18 hit by pitches came in 139 plate appearances and 36 games. Cook is second in HBP in all the minors, behind Braiden Ward of the Rockies system (32). As far as stats go to 1988, the record for HBP in a season in the minors is 41 (2012). His 27 HBP rank third in Eastern League history.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: August 27, 2017 – The Fisher Cats made it three of four from the Yard Goats with a 4-2 win at Delta Dental Stadium. Jon Harris allowed two runs on four hits in his seven innings. He struck out eight. Justin Shafer earned his first save. Anthony Alford had an RBI double in the first inning. Alex Monsalve singled home the go-ahead run in the fifth and Richard Urena added an RBI sacrifice fly.

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Blue Jays lost, 12-0, to the Angels Friday night. Bo Bichette had his 31st double, and Lourdes Gurriel had his 30th. Buffalo won 6-0 over Columbus. Otto Lopez and Rafael Lantigua each drove in a pair of runs. Vancouver won the Friday matinee, 5-3, over Hillsboro with starter Trenton Wallace striking out 11. Class A Dunedin won 7-5 at Bradenton with Blue Jays seventh round pick Peyton Williams (Iowa) hitting two homers.

Sunday Starter:

The Fisher Cats are expected to turn to LHP Jimmy Robbins in the series finale. He made his Double-A debut last Sunday in Hartford, working four scoreless innings as the starter in a 6-1 win.

Robbins is an Orlando native who missed all of 2021 recovering from Tommy John surgery. His high strikeout total has been impressive this season, averaging 11.9 K/9. He had a career-high 11 Ks against Everett on July 31.
