LAST TIME OUT: The New Hampshire Fisher Cats lost to the Somerset Patriots in the second straight game where the two were tied going into the ninth inning. The Fisher Cats have now lost six straight, their most consecutively since 2014 (11). **Adam Kloffenstein** turned in a nice start, throwing 5.2 innings and allowing two earned runs. He walked one and struck out six. Both of the runs against Kloffenstein came on a Josh BreauX homer. New Hampshire stormed back with three runs in the ninth inning. **Spencer Horwitz** homered, **Will Robertson** doubled, and **Luis De Los Santos** added an RBI single in the frame. Somerset tied the game in the eighth, and Yankees top prospect Anthony Volpe hit a three-run homer in the ninth to seal the seal.

WHO'S HOT: **Spencer Horwitz** has the longest hit streak of the Fisher Cats' season, currently at 13 games. He has also reached base in 16 straight games. In his last 15 games, Horwitz is 20-53 (.377) with five doubles, three homers, eight RBIs and 13 walks. **Rafael Lantigua** had an 11 game on-base streak snapped yesterday, and **Zac Cook** had 10-game on base streak snapped as well. **Will Robertson** has an extra-base hit in seven of his last eight games. **John Aiello** is 11-for-34 (.324) over his last 10 games.

SPENCE, PLAYER OF THE WEEK: First baseman Spencer Horwitz was named Eastern League Player of the Week on June 13. Horwitz rides a 13-game hit streak into Saturday's games with Somerset, the second-longest active streak in the league behind Portland's Pedro Castellanos (14). Horwitz is first in the Eastern League and third among Double-A players in June batting average (.391). He is the second weekly award winner for the Fisher Cats this year along with **Max Castillo**, who won Pitcher of the Week on April 18.

WHAT DO YOU SAY, PONCE: Reliever **Gabriel Ponce** was promoted to Triple-A Buffalo yesterday. He finished out his time at Double-A on a dominant stretch. In his last seven appearances, he threw 17.0 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run. The last earned run Ponce gave up was May 14 versus Binghamton, and one unearned run scored in his appearance at Akron on May 27. In his last seven appearances, Ponce has allowed seven hits, walked four and struck out 16. His WHIP in 11.0 innings of work in June is 0.45. At the time of his promotion, Ponce was first on the team in WHIP (0.84) among players with 15+ innings of work.

WE'VE SEEN YOU BEFORE: Somerset is the third team New Hampshire has played twice along with Portland and Binghamton. New Hampshire is 2-8 versus Somerset, though neither team has found their groove at the plate. NH is hitting .194 with 15 doubles, nine homers and a slash line of .194/.272/.337 against Somerset. Somerset is hitting .216 with 17 doubles, eight homers and a slash line of .216/.310/.364. New Hampshire's pitching staff has a 5.61 ERA versus Somerset. New Hampshire did not make an error this series until last night (Rackoski).

CATS AND PATRIOTS IN THE E.L.: New Hampshire has left the fewest runners on base in the Eastern League (375), though they are helped by the fact that they have played more seven-inning doubleheaders (nine) than any other team. Reading has the second-most doubleheaders with six. New Hampshire pitching is tied for second in the league in shutouts (five). Somerset leads the league home runs (82), stolen bases (103), and ERA (3.33).

HOME COOKING: With Tanner Morris (.338) off to Triple-A, Spencer Horwitz has the highest batting average at Delta Dental Stadium (.300), and he hit his second homer at Delta Dental last night. His OBP at home is .411 with 25 hits, 13 walks and 2 HBP. Orelvis Martinez is hitting .258 at DD, and five of his 15 homers have come at home.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: June 18, 2005 – Fisher Cats 4 Thunder 1 – Brad Hassey had a pair of doubles and Ryan Roberts doubled in a pair of runs in the fifth inning to help lead the Fisher Cats to a home win. Josh Banks worked six innings to pick up the win, and Lee Gronkiewicz (gron-KEV-itch) earned his 20th save – in his 20th save opportunity – with a perfect ninth.

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** has broken the New Hampshire single-season record for hit by pitches with 19. Eric Thames was hit by 18 pitches in 2010, but that was in 573 plate appearances over 130 games. Cook's first 18 hit by pitches have come in 139 plate appearances and 36 games. Cook is second in HBP in all of the minors, behind Braiden Ward of High A Spokane (Colorado Rockies) who has 20. As far as stats date to 2005, the record for hit by pitches in a season in the minors in 41 (2012 and 2017).

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: Gabriel Moreno went 3-for-4 and drove in two runs in the Blue Jays 12-3 loss to the Yankees. Casey Lawrence allowed two runs in four innings of relief after being called back up to the Majors....Chavez Young's first career Triple-A homer gave Buffalo an early 2-0 lead, but Lehigh Valley rallied with a pair in the eighth to beat the Bisons 5-4. Young hit seven homers while hitting .265 for New Hampshire last year in 78 games.

COMING UP: The Fisher Cats continue a franchise record 13-game homestand today against the Somerset Patriots (New York Yankees). With the doubleheader on Wednesday (May 7 makeup), the Fisher Cats play their first seven-game series in team history. Next week, the Altoona Curve (Pittsburgh Pirates) come to town for six games.

LAST TIME OUT: Palmer started last Sunday in Binghamton, allowing three runs on six hits over 4.2 innings. Left with the game tied 3-3 after allowing a homer to Brett Baty in fifth. The Rumble Ponies won 7-4.

v. SOMERSET: First appearance

2022: Promoted to Fisher Cats on May 21. Went 1-2 with a 4.18 ERA in 6 starts for Adv. A Vancouver. Was named the Northwest League Pitcher of the Week on May 2 after retiring all 18 batters he faced on May 1 in Hillsboro.

In his first two Double-A starts, Palmer allowed one earned run in each. Both runs scored without an RBI hit (one on a wild pitch, one on a balk).

2021: Spent entire season in the rotation for Class-A Dunedin. Struggled his first month, but was very consistent July, August, and September to finish his first year in pro ball 4-2 with a 3.00 ERA. **Pitched two seven-inning no-hitters for Dunedin** (August 19 vs. Ft. Myers with 10 K – and – September 15 vs. Clearwater with 9 K). Had 83 strikeouts in 63 IP and held Florida State league hitters to a .153 average against. Did not allow a home run in 63 innings pitched.

Obtained: Palmer was selected in the 3rd round of the 2020 draft (77th overall pick) out of Jacksonville.

College: In the 2020 season, Palmer was tied for the ASUN lead and 15th nationally in strikeouts with 41. His 8.20 K/BB ratio was third in the ASUN and 50th in the country. He had a 1.30 ERA in the COVID-19 shortened season. In 2019, Palmer appeared in 21 games and started 9. In 2018, he was the primary setup man, throwing a team-high 27 appearances.

Personal: Ranked the No. 23 prospect in the Toronto system at the beginning of 2022 by MLB.com.
