LAST TIME OUT: The New Hampshire Fisher Cats were shut out for the sixth time this season, 6-0, by the Reading Fightin Phils on Tuesday night in their series opener at FirstEnergy Stadium. New Hampshire had six hits, two of which came from newly promoted Addison Barger. **Luis Quinones** had Double-A season highs in innings pitched (5.1) and strikeouts (T-6), but he was tagged with his second loss of the season. Reading's Ethan Lindow dominated, throwing a quality start with 6.0 shutout innings with two walks and five strikeouts. **Cam Eden** doubled off Lindow in the second inning for New Hampshire's only extra-base hit of the game.

WHO'S HOT: Luis De Los Santos has a six-game hit streak in which he's 7-for-21 (.333), and he tallied at least one hit in every game of the Hartford series. Ryan Gold had his longest hit streak of the year snapped at seven games on a pinch-hit at bat on Sunday. In that stretch, Gold was 8-for-22 (.364) with one double, two homers, five RBIs and four walks. Phil Clarke is 4-for-11 (.363) in his three games since returning from the injured list on July 8. Last Wednesday, Orelvis Martinez had the second two-homer day for a Fisher Cat this season (Sebastian Espino, May 12 vs. Binghamton). Trevor Schwecke is batting 12-for-38 (.316) with three doubles, one triple, one homer and 10 RBIs in July.

K-CITY: Fisher Cats pitching totaled 71 strikeouts over the Hartford series, the most in Double-A from July 4-11. New Hampshire has struck out at least 10 batters in seven of the last 10 games. The staff punched out a season-high 17 batters in a 3-1 loss to Hartford on Thursday. **Yosver Zulueta** (8), **Braden Scott** (5), **Parker Caracci** (4), **Sean Mellen** (4) and **Thomas Ruwe** (T-4) all notched Double-A season-highs for Ks last week against the Goats.

ORELVIS' BOMBS: Orelvis Martinez is tied for third in the Eastern League in homers with 19. More notably, he's on pace to set the single-season home runs record for the Fisher Cats. Chip Cannon (2006) and Eric Thames (2010) are tied for the crown with 27 in a season. 12 players have hit at least 20 homers in a season for the Fisher Cats, most recently Cavan Biggio with 26 in 2018.

SCORING AGAINST THE R-PHILS: New Hampshire is now 2-5 against Reading this season. In five of their seven games against Reading, New Hampshire has scored two runs or fewer. Last night was Reading's second shutout of NH this year and their first of the Cats at home since Aaron Nola beat New Hampshire, 4-0, on May 20, 2015. The Fisher Cats have hit .232 with eight doubles, five homers, and 23 RBIs against Reading. The Fightin Phils are hitting .268 with 12 doubles and 10 homers. **John Aiello** (4-for-13) and **Phil Clarke** (4-for-14) have the best batting averages against the Fightins this season

STARTING (AND FINISHING) STRONG: The two innings in which the Fisher Cats have scored the most runs this year are the first (59) and the ninth (50). New Hampshire is batting .286 in the ninth inning, the best clip in Double-A. Their 50 ninth-inning runs rank second in Double-A behind the Amarillo Sod Poodles (Arizona Diamondbacks, 53). **John Aiello** is 8-for-21 (.381) with two doubles and three walks in the first this season. **Rafael Lantigua** is 16-for-57 (.281) with four doubles in first innings this season. **Luis De Los Santos** is a stunning 12-for-21 (.571) with three doubles, one triple, one homer and eight RBIs in the ninth.

PARKER'S HOUSE: Reliever **Parker Caracci** has been nearly untouchable in his last nine outings. Since giving up seven runs in the ninth inning against Somerset on June 16, Caracci has spun 12.1 scoreless frames. In that span, he's allowed six hits, walked one, and struck out 18. Caracci is a product of Ole Miss, who captured the 2022 national championship. Caracci ranks fifth all-time in program history in saves with 21.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: July 13, 2013 – In a 6-3 win over the Phils at FirstEnergy Stadium, the Fisher Cats hit a pair of late game homers. Gabe Jacobo (juh-KO-bo) broke a 3-3 tie with a solo shot in the seventh and Jack Murphy followed with a homer in the eighth. Deck McGuire struck out eight over six innings for the win.

STOP HITTING ME: Zac Cook has broken the New Hampshire single-season record for hit by pitches with 23. Eric Thames was hit by 18 pitches in 2010, but that was in 573 plate appearances over 130 games. Cook's first 18 hit by pitches came in 139 plate appearances and 36 games. Cook is tied for second in HBP in all the minors, behind Braiden Ward of the Colorado Rockies system (27). Esteury Ruiz of the Padres system also has 23. As far as stats go to 2005, the record for HBP in a season in the minors in 41 (2012).

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: Lourdes Gurriel Jr. went 4-for-4 with a pair of doubles in the Blue Jays 4-3 win over the Phillies. Jordan Romano worked the ninth inning for his 19th save, which is tied for the most among American League relievers. At Triple-A, Iowa exploded late for an 8-2 win over the Bisons. L.J. Talley had three hits, including a triple. Fisher Cat alum Jake Fishman tossed two innings of scoreless relief for Jacksonville (Marlins) in a 4-0 win at Syracuse. Fishman is 4-0 with a 1.79 ERA in 23 games – and could end up being the next alum to make his Major League debut.
