LAST TIME OUT: In their first 44 games of the season, New Hampshire had no walk-off wins and had one walk-off loss. On Thursday, **Spencer Horwitz** gave the Fisher Cats their second walk-off win in three games. **Rafael Lantigua** was the walk-off hero on Tuesday night. New Hampshire trailed by as many as five runs but tied the game up with a four-run ninth. **Orelvis Martinez** had doubles in the ninth and 10th, and **Luis De Los Santos** tied the game, 5-5, with his two-run homer in the ninth. **Phil Clarke** had a 2-RBI single in the ninth to get the rally going. **Mike Ellenbest** earned the win, though he allowed two unearned runs. NH made a season-high four errors. New Hampshire and Portland were rained out yesterday, leading to today's doubleheader.

WHO'S HOT: **Tanner Morris** has an active 16-game on-base streak, the longest for New Hampshire this season. The 16 games is the third-longest active streak in the league and is tied for eighth-longest in the E.L. all year. Morris has hits in 15 of his last 16 games and had a 10-game hit streak snapped last Friday. He is second in the league in OBP (.441), tied for second in runs (35), fifth in walks (30) and fourth in batting average (.320). **Orelvis Martinez** and **John Aiello** have season-long hit streaks at five and six games, respectively. **Rafael Lantigua** capped off a stellar month of May with a walk-off single on May 31 versus Portland. The 5-foot-8 infielder/outfielder hit .329 with 26 hits, 10 doubles and 14 RBIs last month. He is first in the Eastern League in doubles with 15.

MOUNTAIN MEN + CHICKEN TENDIES: Tonight, the New Hampshire Fisher Cats play as the Granite State Mountain Men in game one of the doubleheader and as the Manchester Chicken Tenders in game two. The first jersey honors what New Hampshire's team might have looked like. In 2004, the Fisher Cats edged out the Mountain Men and other finalists as the team name. The Chicken Tenders jersey is an ode to the Puritan Backroom Restaurant, the birthplace of the chicken tender located in Manchester. The jersey includes "Est. 1974."

WE'VE SEEN YOU BEFORE: Portland is the first team New Hampshire has played twice this season. The Fisher Cats took two of three from the Sea Dogs on opening weekend. They lost the opener, 11-6, but won on April 9, 3-0 in six innings, and on April 10, 6-2. The Fisher Cats are now 5-1 against Portland. They are batting .226 with 13 doubles and four homers against the Sea Dogs, and the NH staff has a 4.03 ERA versus Portland.

T-MO, THE ON-BASE MACHINE: **Tanner Morris** has reached base safely in 37 of 41 games played for New Hampshire this year. He is second in the league in OBP at .441. He reached base in 19 of 21 games played in May and has a current 16-game on-base streak. Morris has hits in 15 of his last 16 games with four RBIs, seven doubles, 10 walks, 16 runs and 23 hits in that stretch.

THE TIDES ARE TURNING: New Hampshire entered the Portland 3-7 in one-run games, but they have won three straight one-run contests over the Sea Dogs to improve that record to 6-7. Entering their May 12 game versus Binghamton, New Hampshire had scored 30 runs in the first inning and had a .316 batting average and .423 OBP in the opening frame. In their last 17 games, New Hampshire has scored in the first inning just once (May 25 at Akron). The Fisher Cats have scored just three first-inning runs since May 12.

WHIP IT: **Hayden Juenger** and **Nick Fraze**, the two pitchers on May 31 versus Portland, have the best WHIP on the Fisher Cats team, out of players with more than 20.0 innings of work. Juenger has a 1.11 WHIP to go with an 0-2 record and 3.90 ERA. Fraze has a 1.14 WHIP with an 1-4 record and a 5.66 ERA. Juenger has 14 walks in 32.1 innings and a 67.0% strike rate. Fraze has five walks in 41.1 innings and a 68.0% strike rate.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: June 4, 2019 – The Fisher Cats opened a homestand with a 3-0 win over the Bowie Baysox. Forrest Wall tripled to start the game, and Santiago Espinal followed with an RBI single. New Hampshire scored the game's other runs in the bottom of the second. Chad Spanberger doubled home a run to make it 2-0, and Espinal followed with another RBI single. Nate Pearson worked two perfect innings in his start, striking out three. Wilkin Ortiz followed with five innings of work for the win.

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** is one HBP away from tying the Fisher Cats single-season record. Cook has been hit by 17 pitches this year, and the NH record for most hit-by-pitches in a season was set by Eric Thames in 2010 (18). Cook was the first minor leaguer on record to be hit seven times in his first six games of a season. The 17th HBP, in Akron, has landed Cook on the IL for the Fisher Cats.

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Blue Jays (30-21) won their eighth straight game Thursday night, 8-3, at the Rogers Centre over the Chicago White Sox, but lost to the Twins, 9-3, on Friday. Elsewhere, Kody Clemens made his Major League Debut on May 31 for the Detroit Tigers. Kody was drafted in the third round of the 2018 draft (Texas). He's one of three baseball-playing sons of Roger Clemens. Two of his brothers played for the Fisher Cats, Koby in 2012, and Kacy in 2019.

PORTLAND HERE THROUGH SUNDAY: The Sea Dogs make the first of three visits to Delta Dental Stadium in 2022. The Fisher Cats took two-of-three to open the season at Hadlock Field. Portland will be back here July 22-24, and against August 30-September 4. The Sea Dogs are 22-26, in fourth place in the EL Northeast. After winning 7-of-9 to start their two-week homestand, they have now lost six straight games (three to Somerset, three to New Hampshire).

v. PORTLAND: Worked four innings of scoreless relief to earn win in the third game of the season at Hadlock Field. Struck out five in New Hampshire's 6-2 win.

2021: Spent the entire season in the rotation for Adv. A Vancouver, making 21 starts. Went a career-best six innings five times. Struck out 114 in 102.1 innings, including nine batters twice in June against Eugene. Did allow 108 hits and 45 walks with a 1.50 WHIP.

2019: Appeared in nine games (one start), working 23.1 innings for the Rocky Mountain Vibes (Rookie League).

Career/Personal Notes: Earned Academic All-WAC honors for the third time. Tied a Utah Valley single-season record with 99 strikeouts in 2019. Struck out 11 batters in a game against South Carolina. Prepped at Orem (Utah) High School. As a senior in 2016 named first-team All-State after going 11-1 with a 2.90 ERA. Also batted .426 with 11 doubles and 31 RBIs.

Obtained: Selected by the Brewers in the 14th round of 2019 draft (Utah Valley). The Blue Jays acquired Schultz from the Brewers 5/21. The move completes a past move between the two clubs, as Schultz was the player to be named later in a February trade that saw Derek Fisher head from Toronto to Milwaukee.
