LAST TIME OUT: The New Hampshire Fisher Cats split a pair of shutouts yesterday in their doubleheader versus Portland. In game one, the Granite State Mountain Men won, 4-0, thanks to **Spencer Horwitz**'s 2-RBI double and **LJ Talley**'s two-run homer. **Paxton Schultz** earned his fourth win with 5.1 shutout innings, and **Sean Rackoski** got his first save of 2022. **Gabriel Ponce** impressed with three shutout innings in game two, a 2-0 loss to Portland. Ponce has not allowed an earned run in his last 11.0 innings on the mound.

WHO'S HOT: **Tanner Morris** has an active 17-game on-base streak, the longest for New Hampshire this season. The 17 games is the third-longest active streak in the league and is eighth-longest in the E.L. all year. Morris has hits in 16 of his last 17 games and had a 10-game hit streak snapped last Friday. He is second in the league in OBP (.440), third in runs (35), fifth in walks (30) and third in batting average (.320). **John Aiello** had season-long hit streaks of seven games snapped in game two of yesterday's double header. **Rafael Lantigua** capped off a stellar month of May with a walk-off single on May 31 versus Portland. The 5-foot-8 infielder/outfielder hit .329 with 26 hits, 10 doubles and 14 RBIs last month. He is first in the Eastern League in doubles with 15.

MOUNTAIN MEN + CHICKEN TENDIES: Yesterday, the New Hampshire Fisher Cats played as the Granite State Mountain Men in game one of the doubleheader and as the Manchester Chicken Tenders in game two. The first jersey honored the team name that finished third place in the fan voting back in 2004. The hat featured the beloved "Old Man of the Mountain." The Chicken Tenders jersey was an ode to the Puritan Backroom Restaurant, the birthplace of the chicken tender located in Manchester. The jersey includes "Est. 1974," the year it was invented.

WE'VE SEEN YOU BEFORE: Portland is the first team New Hampshire has played twice this season. The Fisher Cats took two of three from the Sea Dogs on opening weekend. They lost the opener, 11-6, but won on April 9, 3-0 in six innings, and on April 10, 6-2. The Fisher Cats are now 6-2 against Portland. They are batting .211 with 14 doubles and five homers against the Sea Dogs, and the NH staff has a 3.44 ERA versus Portland.

T-MO, THE ON-BASE MACHINE: **Tanner Morris** has reached base safely in 38 of 42 games played for New Hampshire this year. He is second in the league in OBP at .440. He reached base in 19 of 21 games played in May and has a current 17-game on-base streak. Morris has hits in 16 of his last 17 games with four RBIs, seven doubles, 10 walks, 16 runs and 24 hits in that stretch.

THE TIDES ARE TURNING: New Hampshire entered the Portland 3-7 in one-run games, but they won three straight one-run contests over the Sea Dogs to improve that record to 6-7. Entering their May 12 game versus Binghamton, New Hampshire had scored 30 runs in the first inning and had a .316 batting average and .423 OBP in the opening frame. In their last 19 games, New Hampshire has scored in the first inning just twice (May 25 at Akron, June 4-1 vs. Portland). The Fisher Cats have scored just five first-inning runs since May 12.

WHIP IT: **Gabriel Ponce**, **Hayden Juenger** and **Nick Fraze** have the best WHIP on the Fisher Cats team, out of players with more than 20.0 innings of work. Ponce has a 1.01 WHIP with an 0-2 record and a 2.66 ERA. He has not allowed an earned run in his last 11.0 innings on the hill. Juenger has a 1.11 WHIP to go with an 0-2 record and 3.90 ERA. Fraze has a 1.14 WHIP with an 1-4 record and a 5.66 ERA. Juenger has 14 walks in 32.1 innings and a 67.0% strike rate. Fraze has five walks in 41.1 innings and a 68.0% strike rate.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: June 5, 2021 – After dropping the first four games in the series to Binghamton, the Fisher Cats finally broke through with an 8-3 win. Samad Taylor's second home run of the game came in a five-run eighth as the Fisher Cats broke a 3-3 tie. Gabriel Moreno also homered and drove in three runs in the game. Three pitchers worked for New Hampshire with Curtis Taylor (2.2 scoreless) credited with the win in relief of starter Johnny Barbato (bar-BAY-to).

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** is one HBP away from tying the Fisher Cats single-season record. Cook has been hit by 17 pitches this year, and the NH record for most hit-by-pitches in a season was set by Eric Thames in 2010 (18). Cook was the first minor leaguer on record to be hit seven times in his first six games of a season. The 17th HBP, in Akron, has landed Cook on the IL for the Fisher Cats.

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Blue Jays (31-21) have won nine of their last 10 games and won decisively, 12-3, over the Minnesota Twins on Saturday afternoon. Vlad Guerrero Jr. is 5-for-18 in his last four games with three homers and five RBIs. Earlier this season, Guerrero had a 15-game hit streak that went from May 2 to May 18. Guerrero is hitting .258 with six doubles, 12 homers and 29 RBIs this year.

PORTLAND WILL BE BACK: The Sea Dogs make the first of three visits to Delta Dental Stadium in 2022. The Fisher Cats took two-of-three to open the season at Hadlock Field. Portland will be back here July 22-24, and against August 30-September 4. The Sea Dogs are 22-26, in fourth place in the EL Northeast. After winning 7-of-9 to start their two-week homestand, they lost seven straight games (three to Somerset, four to New Hampshire) before a win yesterday in game two.

LAST TIME OUT: Palmer went 4.2 innings at Akron, allowing one run that scored on a balk. He has yet to allow an RBI hit this season with New Hampshire. He walked three, struck out four and hit two batters.

v. Portland:

2022: Promoted to Fisher Cats on May 21. Went 1-2 with a 4.18 ERA in 6 starts for Adv. A Vancouver. Was named the Northwest League Pitcher of the Week on May 2 after retiring all 18 batters he faced on May 1 in Hillsboro.

In his first two Double-A starts, Palmer allowed one earned run in each. Both runs scored without an RBI hit (one on a wild pitch, one on a balk).

2021: Spent entire season in the rotation for Class-A Dunedin. Struggled his first month, but was very consistent July, August, and September to finish his first year in pro ball 4-2 with a 3.00 ERA. **Pitched two seven-inning no-hitters for Dunedin** (August 19 vs. Ft. Myers with 10 K – and – September 15 vs. Clearwater with 9 K). Had 83 strikeouts in 63 IP and held Florida State league hitters to a .153 average against. Did not allow a home run in 63 innings pitched.

Obtained: Palmer was selected in the 3rd round of the 2020 draft (77th overall pick) out of Jacksonville.

College: In the 2020 season, Palmer was tied for the ASUN lead and 15th nationally in strikeouts with 41. His 8.20 K/BB ratio was third in the ASUN and 50th in the country. He had a 1.30 ERA in the COVID-19 shortened season. In 2019, Palmer appeared in 21 games and started 9. In 2018, he was the primary setup man, throwing a team-high 27 appearances.

Personal: Ranked the No. 23 prospect in the Toronto system at the beginning of 2022 by MLB.com.
