LAST TIME OUT: New Hampshire lost, 4-2, in their third straight defeat at the hands of the Akron RubberDucks. **Hayden Juenger** retired the first seven batters he faced and gave up one run in 3.0 innings of work. The run scored on a solo homer from Chris Roller. **Phil Clarke** drove in **Rafael Lantigua** in the sixth, and Lantigua hit a sac fly to score **Luis De Los Santos** in the eighth. Lantigua, De Los Santos and **John Aiello** each doubled, combining for three of New Hampshire's four hits. With the game tied, 2-2, going into the bottom of the eighth, Guardians No. 2 prospect George Valera smashed a two-run homer off **Brady Lail**. Joey Cantillo pitched a gem for Akron as he worked 4.1 perfect innings and finished with 5.0 innings pitched, allowing two baserunners.

OUT IN ERIE AND AKRON: The current two-week road trip marks the first time New Hampshire has traveled to Erie, Pennsylvania and Akron, Ohio since July 30 through August 4, 2019. The Fisher Cats took two of three from the RubberDucks, and all three games were one-run contests. The Cats lost two of three to the SeaWolves.

WHO'S HOT: **Tanner Morris'** 10-game hit streak is tied for the second-longest active streak in the Eastern League with and Shane Matheny (Richmond). He is 15-for-39 (.385) in that span. Morris is third in the league in OBP (.447), third in runs (31), fifth in walks (27) and seventh in batting average (.317). **Rafael Lantigua** is 13-for-39 (.333) over his last 10 games with six doubles and eight RBIs. He is second in the Eastern League in doubles with 13. Lantigua is hitting .306 in May after hitting .200 in April. **Orelvis Martinez** is 17-for-66 (.258) with a double, seven homers and 18 RBIs in May. He hit .188 in April. Martinez is tied for first in the league in home runs with 13, tied for fifth in RBIs (28) and ninth in slugging percentage (.537).

T-MO, THE ON-BASE MACHINE: **Tanner Morris** has reached base safely in 31 of 35 games played for New Hampshire this year. He is third in the league in OBP at .447, trailing only Gunnar Henderson of Bowie (.457) and Devlin Granberg of Portland (.451). He has reached base in 15 of 17 games played in May and has a current 10-game hit streak. The last game in which he did not reach base was May 11 vs. Binghamton.

FINISHING STRONG: New Hampshire is third among all minor league teams in ninth-inning batting average (.313), second in OBP (.439) and first in runs scored (32). The Fisher Cats scored three runs in the ninth in two straight games last Friday and Saturday at Erie. NH has second 33 runs in the first inning and 32 in the ninth. 65 of their 183 runs (35.1%) have come in the first and ninth innings.

SO CLOSE, YET SO FAR: New Hampshire tallied three runs in the top of the ninth inning at Erie last Friday night but lost by one, 8-7. The comeback marked the fifth time the Fisher Cats have tallied multiple runs in their last frame at the plate but lost by one. The first came on April 22 at Altoona, when New Hampshire scored five in the top of the ninth but lost, 8-7. New Hampshire has never come back from six-run deficit to win in the team's history.

WHAMMY (x5): The Fisher Cats five home runs against Binghamton on May 12 was for their second five-homer game of the season. The other came in a 9-7 win at Altoona on April 23. Prior to that game, the last time New Hampshire hit five big flies at Delta Dental Stadium was July 7, 2013, also versus Binghamton. The Fisher Cats have hit five homers at Delta Dental six times in their history, with the first coming on July 18, 2006 versus Portland. They have had another four five-homer games on the road.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: May 27, 2013 – Ryan Tepera (tuh-PARE-uh) allowed two runs over five innings, striking out seven, as the Fisher Cats rolled to a 12-3 win over New Britain in Manchester. Kevin Nolan homered in the third to give the Fisher Cats a 4-2 lead. Jon Talley (no relation to LJ Talley) hit a grand slam in a seven-run eighth inning, his first Double-A home run.

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** is two HBP's away from tying the Fisher Cats single-season record. Cook has been hit by 16 pitches this year, and the NH record for most hit-by-pitches in a season was set by Eric Thames in 2010 (18). Cook was the first minor leaguer on record to be hit seven times in his first six games of a season. Last season, Austin Martin was hit 14 times in the 56 games he played with New Hampshire before the Blue Jays traded him to the Royals organization. The New Hampshire Fisher Cats have been hit by 36 pitches this season, the most in the Eastern League.

PROSPECTS IN MANCHESTER: New Hampshire has nine top-30 prospects on their team, according to MLB.com: **Orelvis Martinez** (No. 2), **Adam Kloffenstein** (No. 11), **Hagen Danner** (No. 17), **Trent Palmer** (No. 23), **Joey Murray** (No. 24), **Sebastian Espino** (No. 25), **Hayden Juenger** (No. 26) **Tanner Morris** (No. 29) and **Spencer Horwitz** (No. 30).

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: Which Fisher Cat alums have hit the most home runs so far in 2022? Vladimir Guerrero Jr. hit his ninth last night in Anaheim in the Blue Jays 6-3 win over the Angels. Rowdy Tellez has hit nine homers for the Milwaukee Brewers. Kevin Pillar (pi-LARR) has hit nine this year for Triple-A Oklahoma City. Pillar signed a minor league deal with the Dodgers in the off-season. The veteran of more than 1000 MLB games has played this year in the Pacific Coast League, where he's hitting .315 (7th) and has 34 RBI (4th).

Career/Personal Notes: Earned Academic All-WAC honors for the third time. Tied a Utah Valley single-season record with 99 strikeouts in 2019. Struck out 11 batters in a game against South Carolina. Prepped at Orem (Utah) High School. As a senior in 2016 named first-team All-State after going 11-1 with a 2.90 ERA. Also batted .426 with 11 doubles and 31 RBIs.

Obtained: Selected by the Brewers in the 14th round of 2019 draft (Utah Valley). The Blue Jays acquired Schultz from the Brewers 5/2/21. The move completes a past move between the two clubs, as Schultz was the player to be named later in a February trade that saw Derek Fisher head from Toronto to Milwaukee.
