LAST TIME OUT: New Hampshire pitching tossed their fifth shutout of the season last night, and the Fisher Cats won, 4-0. **Hayden Juenger** has gone scoreless in his last three appearances and threw 4.0 shutout frames with five strikeouts. **Nick Frazee** earned the win with 3.0 shutout innings with four strikeouts. The only baserunner to reach against him was on a bunt single. **John Aiello** drove in **Cam Eden** three times and had career-high in hits (three) and RBIs (three). **Spencer Horwitz** extended his hit streak to seven with a 2-for-5 day at the plate.

WHO'S HOT: **Spencer Horwitz** has a seven-game hit streak and 10-game on-base streak. In his last 10 games, Horwitz is 11-30 (.367) with three doubles, a homer, six RBIs and 10 walks with a 1.104 OPS. **John Aiello** is 13-for-37 (.351) with three doubles over his last 10 games. **Rafael Lantigua** had a six-game walk streak. He has a .395 OBP over his last 10 games and is 10-36 (.278) at the plate. He capped off a stellar month of May with a walk-off single on May 31 versus Portland. The 5-foot-8 infielder/outfielder hit .329 with 26 hits, 10 doubles and 14 RBIs last month. He is tied for first in the Eastern League in doubles with 15.

DÉJÀ VU: New Hampshire's 9-5 win Thursday was oddly reminiscent of their 10-5 victory at Binghamton on May 10, 2019. In yesterday's game, the Fisher Cats scored seven runs on seven hits in the first inning. In the May 10, 2019 game, the Fisher Cats scored eight runs on five hits in the first inning and were helped out by two Binghamton errors. Santiago Espinal went 4-for-6 with five RBIs. He and Alberto Mineo homered back-to-back in the first.

WE'VE SEEN YOU BEFORE: Binghamton is the second team New Hampshire has played twice. The Fisher Cats and Rumble Ponies split a six-game series from May 10-15. New Hampshire lost the first two games before a five-homer night gave them a win, 7-2, on May 12. **Sebastian Espino**, the former Mets farmhand, is 9-for-28 (.324) with three doubles and three homers against Binghamton this season. NH is batting .255 with 21 doubles, 11 homers and 40 RBIs versus Binghamton. The staff's ERA is 4.13 against the Ponies.

SO LONG, T-MO: **Tanner Morris**, one of the best hitters in the league, was promoted to Triple-A Buffalo on June 8. Morris had a 17-game on-base streak in which he went 24-for-66 (.364) with seven doubles, one homer, five RBIs, 10 walks, 15 strikeouts, a .455 OBP and a .970 OPS. Morris had a 10-game hit streak within the on-base streak, too. At the time of his promotion, Morris was third in the league in OBP (.430), tied for third in runs (35), fifth in walks (30) and fifth in batting average (.312). He reached base safely in 38 of 43 games played for New Hampshire this year.

THE TIDES ARE TURNING: New Hampshire entered the Portland series with a 3-7 record in one-run games. They have now won four one-run games over the last week (three versus Portland, one at Binghamton) to bring that record to 7-7. Entering their May 12 game versus Binghamton, New Hampshire had scored 30 runs in the first inning and had a .316 batting average and .423 OBP in the opening frame. In their last 24 games, New Hampshire has scored in the first inning three times (May 25 at Akron, June 4 game one vs. Portland, June 9 at Binghamton).

IN THE FIELD: The New Hampshire Fisher Cats are smack in the middle of the Eastern League in team fielding percentage at sixth out of 12 (.979). They had four errors in a game against Portland. Without those, the Cats would be tied for third-fewest errors in the league but are instead have the sixth-fewest with 37. **Spencer Horwitz** had a 36-game streak without an error snapped Thursday with a dropped catch at first. **Zac Cook** is tied for sixth in the league with an active 36-game streak without an error.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: June 11, 2021—At Hadlock Field, the Fisher Cats entered the ninth down 6-4. Gabriel Moreno homered, LJ Talley doubled, and Kevin Vicuna singled him home to make it 6-6. In the top of the tenth, the Fisher Cats exploded for eight runs. Moreno had a two-run double, Talley added a two-run double, and Nick Podkul homered in a 14-6 win over Portland. Moreno, Talley and Vicuna had four hits each, part of a 20-hit attack.

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** has tied the New Hampshire single-season record for hit by pitches with 18. Eric Thames was hit by 18 pitches in 2010, but that was in 573 plate appearances over 130 games. Cook's 18 hit by pitches have come in 139 plate appearances and 36 games. Cook is tied for the most HBP in all of the minors with Braiden Ward of High A Spokane (Colorado Rockies). Cook was the first minor leaguer on record to be hit seven times in his first six games of a season.

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: Gabriel Moreno is ranked the No. 1 prospect in the Toronto Blue Jays system and is ranked No. 4 overall by MLB.com. He is fourth among qualifying players in the International League at .324. He hit .380 in the month of May with four doubles, one homer and 14 RBIs. He has 10 multi-hit games this year, including three four-hit games. Last year with New Hampshire, Moreno hit .373 with nine doubles, one triple and eight homers. He led the team in batting average among players with at least 10 games played. Moreno is set to become the sixth former Fisher Cats to make his MLB debut this year. The others five were RHP Zach Jackson, LHP Zach Logue, IF Christian Lopes, IF/OF Vinny Capra and LHP Danny Young.

LAST TIME OUT: On the wrong end of a 2-0 defeat to Portland in the second game of last Saturday's doubleheader in Manchester. Allowed a pair of runs in the third inning- but did strike out seven in four innings in his first home game with the Fisher Cats.

v. BINGHAMTON: First appearance

2022: Opened season with Adv. A Vancouver, going 0-2 with a 3.81 ERA in six starts. Struck out 30 in 25 IP.

2021: Kloffenstein spent the entire season with Class A Advanced Vancouver, making a career-high 23 starts. He pitched 101.1 innings and had a 7-7 record with a 6.22 ERA. He walked 61 batters and struck out 107.

2019: Had a 4-4 record and a 2.24 ERA with the Vancouver Canadians, who were the Class A short season affiliate of the Blue Jays in 2019. Kloff made 13 starts and threw 64.1 innings, walking 23 and striking out 64. He had a career-best WHIP of 1.09, and opponents hit .204 against him.

2018: Pitched with the GCL Blue Jays at the rookie level. He threw just 2.0 innings across two starts in his rookie season.

Obtained: Kloffenstein was selected in the third round and 88th overall in the 2018 draft. He was drafted out of Magnolia High School, where he was teammates with Blue Jays prospect Jordan Groshans. He was originally committed to play at TCU and received a \$2.45 million signing bonus.

Personal: Ranked the No. 11 prospect in the Toronto system at the beginning of 2022. The slider is Kloffenstein's highest-rated pitch.
