LAST TIME OUT: The Fisher Cats got smoked, 15-4, by the Portland Sea Dogs. From the moment gates opened ahead of Chris Sale's rehab start, Portland owned the night. Sale went 4.0 innings and allowed four hits and one earned run. He walked none and struck out seven. **Chris Bec** tagged the Red Sox ace with a RBI double off the wall in left, and **Cam Eden**, **Trevor Schwecke**, and **Orelvis Martinez** got hits off Sale as well. **Yosver Zulueta** went 1.2 innings in his Double-A debut and allowed two runs with two walks and one strikeout. Portland had four home runs and 15 hits, both season-highs allowed by New Hampshire pitching.

WHO'S HOT: **Spencer Horwitz** had his eight-game hit streak snapped last night with an 0-for-4 night. His month of June was stellar, notching hits in 21 of his 24 starts. The Blue Jays 30th ranked prospect (MLB.com) hit .370 this month with 30 hits, nine doubles, five homers and 19 walks. His June batting average was fourth in all of Double-A, and he had a .490 OBP and a 1.157 OPS in June as well. In his last six games, **Zac Cook** is 7-for-20 (.350) with two doubles, a homer, a walk-off single and six RBIs. **Rafael Lantigua** has a six-game hit streak and is 9-for-29 (.310) with three doubles, two RBIs and two multi-hit games in that stretch.

STARTING (AND FINISHING) STRONG: The two innings in which the Fisher Cats have scored the most runs this year are the first (52) and the ninth (48). New Hampshire is batting .296 in the first inning, the fourth-best clip in Double-A. Their 14 first-inning homers rank second in Double-A and seventh across all the minors. **Spencer Horwitz** leads all active Fisher Cats in first-inning batting average, going 16-for-44 (.364) with three doubles, one triple, two homers and 11 RBIs. **Rafael Lantigua** is 14-for-49 (.286) with four doubles in first innings this season. **Luis De Los Santos** is a stunning 11-for-20 (.550) with three doubles, one triple, one homer and seven RBIs in the ninth inning this year. **Orelvis Martinez** is 6-for-17 (.353) with two doubles and two homers in the ninth.

SEAN OF THE PEN: **Sean Mellen** has been one of the best relievers for the Fisher Cats of late. Mellen, the lefty from Norwood, Massachusetts, has a 1-1 record and a 1.56 ERA across his last 10 outings (17.1 innings). He also has one save in that stretch with six walks and 18 strikeouts. In each of the last two months, Mellen has had an ERA under 2.00. In May, it was 1.86, and in June it was 1.69.

HELLO, OLD FRIEND: New Hampshire begins the second half of the 2022 season at the same park where they started the first half: Hadlock Field in Portland, Maine. The Fisher Cats are 6-6 versus the Red Sox affiliate this year, but New Hampshire has won both series. The rivalry has featured five one-run games and two two-run games. NH has walked off versus Portland twice, and the Sea Dogs returned the favor once. The Fisher Cats are batting .210 against Portland with 25 doubles, eight homers, and 46 RBIs, while Portland is hitting .250 with 19 doubles, four triples, eight homers and 54 RBIs against New Hampshire. The Fisher Cats' team ERA against the Sea Dogs this year is 4.70.

SPENCER AND THE DOGS: **Spencer Horwitz** is hitting .314 in 11 games played against the Portland Sea Dogs this season with one home runs and eight RBIs. He's drawn nine walks and has .478 OBP. He had a walk-off single over Portland one June 2 at Delta Dental Stadium in a 8-7 game that took 10 innings. The win was the fourth in the Fisher Cats' season-long five-game winning streak.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: July 1, 2007 – Ryan Patterson and David Smith hit homers to help the Fisher Cats beat the Sea Dogs, 5-2, at Hadlock Field. Patterson led off the fifth with his seventh homer to give the Fisher Cats a 1-0 lead. John Schneider singled and scored and Aaron Mathews, who had three hits, singled in another run in the frame. Ismael (ish-my-ELL) Ramirez worked seven scoreless innings to win, striking out four. Tracy Thorpe recorded the final four outs for his fourth save.

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** has broken the New Hampshire single-season record for hit by pitches with 20. Eric Thames was hit by 18 pitches in 2010, but that was in 573 plate appearances over 130 games. Cook's first 18 hit by pitches came in 139 plate appearances and 36 games. Cook is third in HBP in all of the minors, behind Braiden Ward of the Colorado Rockies system (25) and Esteury Ruiz of the Padres system (22). As far as stats date to 2005, the record for hit by pitches in a season in the minors in 41 (2012 and 2017).

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Blue Jays defeated the Tampa Bay Rays, 4-1, last night at home. Yusei Kikuchi earned his third win of the year, going 6.0 innings with eight strikeouts. He allowed four hits and one earned run. Teoscar Hernandez was 3-for-4 with a double, homer and two RBIs. Santiago Espinal was 2-for-4 with a two-run homer, his eighth of the season. Adam Cimber earned his fourth save with a perfect ninth inning.

COMING UP: The final homestand before the All-Star break will be July 4-10 vs. Hartford. That series will include a spectacular Atlas Fireworks Show on a special Monday night game on July 4. Tickets are available through the Fisher Cats website at nhfishercats.com.

LAST TIME OUT: Palmer last worked Friday, June 24 at Delta Dental Stadium against Altoona. Struggled, allowing four hits, four runs, and walking four in just 2.2 innings in an 8-7 loss. He struck out two batters, but didn't figure in the decision. Four walks tied a career high.

v. PORTLAND: On the wrong end of a 2-0 loss to the Sea Dogs in Manchester on June 5 when he worked four innings. Gave up an RBI single to Kole Cottam in 2nd, and a solo homer to David Hamilton in 3rd.

2022: Promoted to Fisher Cats on May 21. Went 1-2 with a 4.18 ERA in 6 starts for Adv. A Vancouver. Was named the Northwest League Pitcher of the Week on May 2 after retiring all 18 batters he faced on May 1 in Hillsboro.

In his first two Double-A starts, Palmer allowed one earned run in each. Both runs scored without an RBI hit (one on a wild pitch, one on a balk).

2021: Spent entire season in the rotation for Class-A Dunedin. Struggled his first month, but was very consistent July, August, and September to finish his first year in pro ball 4-2 with a 3.00 ERA. **Pitched two seven-inning no-hitters for Dunedin** (August 19 vs. Ft. Myers with 10 K – and – September 15 vs. Clearwater with 9 K). Had 83 strikeouts in 63 IP and held Florida State league hitters to a .153 average against. Did not allow a home run in 63 innings pitched.

Obtained: Palmer was selected in the 3rd round of the 2020 draft (77th overall pick) out of Jacksonville.

College: In the 2020 season, Palmer was tied for the ASUN lead and 15th nationally in strikeouts with 41. His 8.20 K/BB ratio was third in the ASUN and 50th in the country. He had a 1.30 ERA in the COVID-19 shortened season. In 2019, Palmer appeared in 21 games and started 9. In 2018, he was the primary setup man, throwing a team-high 27 appearances.

Personal: Ranked the No. 23 prospect in the Toronto system at the beginning of 2022 by MLB.com.
