LAST TIME OUT: The Fisher Cats had their biggest win of the season on Tuesday, defeating the Erie SeaWolves, 13-3. The 13 runs and 18 hits were both season-highs for the Cats, and New Hampshire scored seven runs on eight hits in the ninth inning. **Rafael Lantigua** and **Phil Clarke** each had four-hit games, their first since August 2021 with Class A Advanced Vancouver. **Orelvis Martinez** and **Will Robertson** both homered in the ninth, and Martinez's hit the top of the Erie Insurance Arena in left field of UPMC Park. **Nick Frazee** struck out a career-high nine batters, and **Cre Finck** tossed his best relief outing with 2.0 scoreless, hitless innings.

THE RETURN OF THE FISHER BATS: Tuesday's 13-3 win marked the first time New Hampshire scored double-digit runs since their 10-2 win versus Reading on April 27. It was the Cats' third time scoring 10+ runs this year. The seven-run, eight-hit ninth innings marked the largest output in a frame all season. The Cats also set a season-high mark for doubles (7) and extra-base hits (9). Eight Fisher Cats notched a hit, and six had multiple hits. Erie entered the series with the best BAA (.200) and WHIP (1.11) in the league.

OUT IN ERIE AND AKRON: The current two-week road trip marks the first time New Hampshire has traveled to Erie, Pennsylvania and Akron, Ohio since July 30 through August 4, 2019. The Fisher Cats took two of three from the RubberDucks, and all three games were one-run contests. The Cats lost two of three to the SeaWolves.

WHO'S HOT: **Rafael Lantigua** is 12-for-36 (.333) with four doubles and five RBIs in the month of May. He hit a double in three straight games from May 5-8. Lantigua went 4-for-5 with a double and three RBIs on May 17 at Erie. **Tanner Morris** is 15-for-43 (.349) with two doubles, a triple, two homers and eight walks this month. He has a .451 OBP in May. Morris is third in the league in OBP (.448) and fourth in walks (24). **Orelvis Martinez** is 13-for-44 (.295) with a double, five homers and 14 RBIs this month. He hit .188 in April. Martinez leads the league in home runs with 11. **John Aiello** played three games against Binghamton and went 3-for-10 with two doubles, a homer and four RBIs.

SWINGING FOR THE FENCES: New Hampshire hit home runs in three of their six games last week, and the Fisher Cats went 2-1 in those games. NH is third in the Eastern League in homers with 41. Somerset has 47, and Richmond has 45. New Hampshire is 12-7 in games where they homer, and 4-10 when they do not. They have an 9-3 record when they homer twice or more in a game.

WHAMMY (x5): The Fisher Cats five home runs against Binghamton made for their second five-homer game of the season. The other came in a 9-7 win at Altoona on April 23. Prior to last night, the last time New Hampshire hit five big flies at Delta Dental Stadium was July 7, 2013, also versus Binghamton. The Fisher Cats have hit five homers at Delta Dental six times in their history, with the first coming on July 18, 2006 versus Portland. They have had another four five-homer games on the road.

THREE STRAIGHT AT THE PLATE: **Sebastian Espino** homered in his last at bat on Wednesday against Binghamton and then in his first two at bats of Thursday's game. He is the second known Fisher Cat to homer in three consecutive at bats. Michael Negron did so in a three-homer game against Binghamton in 2005.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: May 19, 2005 – The Fisher Cats scored three runs in the top of the first inning en route to a 6-2 win over the Trenton Thunder (Yankees). Maikel Jova (My-KELL HO-vuh) hit a three-run homer in the first and Erik Kratz added a solo shot in the sixth. Shaun Marcum allowed one run – on one hit – over six innings. The win was his sixth in his last seven starts and his seventh quality start of the season.

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** is the first minor leaguer on record to be hit seven times in his first six games of a season. The NH record for most hit-by-pitches in a season was set by Eric Thames in 2010 (18). Last season, Austin Martin was hit 14 times in the 56 games he played with New Hampshire before the Blue Jays traded him to the Royals organization. Cook has been hit by 15 pitches so far this year. The New Hampshire Fisher Cats have been hit by 33 pitches this season, the most in the Eastern League.

MUST-SEE ORELVIS: **Orelvis Martinez** is ranked the No. 2 prospect in the Blue Jays system to start the 2022 season. He has 25 hits this season, including 15 extra base hits (four doubles, 11 home runs). He has hit 11 homers to lead the team and is tied for third-most among all Double-A players and first in the E.L. His six homers in April were tops in the Blue Jays minor league organization.

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Toronto Blue Jays defeated the Seattle Mariners, 3-0, Tuesday night to deliver the Jays first back-to-back wins since May 1. RHP Jose Berrios tossed a gem with 7.0 shutout innings. He walked two and struck out four, allowing just two hits. George Springer knocked in all three runs with a bases-clearing triple in the second inning. Santiago Espinal went 1-for-3, and Vladimir Guerrero Jr. extended his hit streak to 14 games with a single in the first inning. Guerrero added another last night to make the streak 15. Espinal and Guerrero both played for New Hampshire.

COMING UP: The Fisher Cats continue their two-week road trip in Erie, Pennsylvania and Akron, Ohio to face the SeaWolves (Tigers) and RubberDucks (Guardians).

Schultz is in his second season with the Blue Jays organization. 24-year old, originally drafted by the Brewers, spent 2021 at Adv. A Vancouver with a 5-7 record and a 5.28 ERA in 22G/21GS.

LAST TIME OUT: Worked five innings in relief in his debut in the Blue Jays organization last week against Binghamton. Allowed just one run on a solo shot.

v. ERIE: Lail went 3-1 in five appearances, four starts, against Erie when with the Trenton Thunder.

2022: Transferred to Fisher Cats on May 12. He pitched this season with the High Point Rockers, a team in the independent Atlantic League. There he earned a 2-1 record with a 0.95 ERA in three starts, walking two and striking out 19.

2021: Spent 2021 with Triple-A Tacoma and Triple-A Lehigh Valley. Tallied a 0-1 and 1.50 ERA record in four appearances and one start with Tacoma before he was DFAed. The Phillies claimed him off waivers and assigned him to Lehigh Valley on June 10, 2021. He had a 1-0 record and a 6.08 ERA with the IronPigs, tossing 31 appearances and one start. He threw 40 innings with LHV with 25 walks and 43 strikeouts.

MLB: Lail has pitched 21 innings in the majors across 11 appearances. He has made appearances for the Yankees, White Sox, and Mariners. He pitched one game with the Yankees in 2019, throwing 2.2 innings and allowing three runs. He then pitched one game for the White Sox in 2020, throwing 1.1 innings and giving up no runs. He then pitched 17 innings for the Mariners across the 2020 and 2021 seasons, allowing 11 earned runs. He gave up seven big league homers, walked eight and struck out 15 with an even 6.00 ERA. He is the first player since 1921 to make his first three MLB starts with three different teams.

Obtained: Drafted in the 18th round of the 2012 MLB draft, going 577th overall to the New York Yankees. He has spent time in the Yankees, White Sox, Mariners and now Blue Jays system.
