LAST TIME OUT: Game 99 was one to remember, as the Fisher Cats walked off for a 7-6 win over the Richmond Flying Squirrels. With one out in the ninth, **John Aiello** crushed a solo homer over the right field wall, his sixth blast of the season. The walk-off dinger was the first for New Hampshire since Cavan Biggio's on August 16, 2018. Four pitchers—**Adam Kloffenstein**, **Sean Mellen**, **Braden Scott** and **Jimmy Burnette**—combined for the most strikeouts in a game in team history with 19. Scott struck out six of the seven batters he faced, and Burnette K'ed in the side in the ninth. **Zach Britton** had a stellar game as well, finishing 3-for-5 with two runs and two RBIs. His homer in the eighth inning tied the game, 6-6. New Hampshire trailed by as many as four runs in the game.

WHO'S HOT: **Rafael Lantigua** has his season-long hit streak, currently at nine games. In that span, he's 11-for-35 (.314) with three home runs. **Luis De Los Santos** had a seven-game hit streak snapped on Wednesday night, and he batted 11-for-25 (.440) with four doubles, one homer and five RBIs during the streak. He hit .338 in July with 26 hits in 77 at bats. After hitting .300 in 69 games with Advanced-A Vancouver, **Addison Barger** is off to a terrific start at Double-A. In 17 starts, he has nine multi-hit games and has been held hitless just twice. He's batting .418 in 75 plate appearances with four homers.

LUCKY NUMBER 19: The Fisher Cats set a new franchise record for strikeouts in a game last night, recording a whopping 19 versus Richmond. The last 13 outs the Squirrels made at the plate were all Ks. Starter **Adam Kloffenstein** had six. **Sean Mellen** had four. **Braden Scott** had six (tied career-high) and faced seven batters across the seventh and eighth innings, and **Jimmy Burnette** finished out the night with three. The previous record for New Hampshire was 18, done twice, but both of those came in extra-inning games. The previous high for a nine-inning game was 17, most recently on July 7 versus Hartford.

TIEDEMANN IN THE HOUSE: Blue Jays No. 3 prospect, and No. 61 overall prospect, Tariq "Ricky" Tiedemann joins the NH today and will make his first Double-A start at 19 years old. The 6-foot-4 lefty pitched a perfect inning in the Sirius XM All-Star Futures Game on July 16 at Dodger Stadium. He made six starts with Single-A Dunedin and had a 1.80 ERA in 30.0 innings. With High-A Vancouver, he made eight starts with a 2.39 ERA. He has 6+ strikeouts in 13 of his 14 starts this year, striking out a career-high 10 on May 13 vs. Tampa (Yankees Single-A). He was a third-round draft pick in 2021 out of Golden West Junior College in California. He's from Long Beach.

IT'S NUTS: These are the first games between New Hampshire and Richmond since the Fisher Cats swept a three-game series at The Diamond June 14-16, 2019. Richmond is 20-10 all-time in New Hampshire, which doesn't include a split of two games the teams played in the 2011 Eastern League Championship Series (won by the Fisher Cats). The Flying Squirrels, who have already secured a spot in the 2022 playoffs by finishing in first place in the first half of the season, lead the all-time series with New Hampshire, 36-26.

ORELVIS' BOMBS: **Orelvis Martinez** had his third two-homer game of the season on July 28 at Binghamton, and he leads the Eastern League with 24 home runs. At age 20, Martinez is the youngest of the 13 players with 20+ Double-A home runs. The second youngest are all 23 (Leandro Cedeno of Amarillo, Michael Toglia of Hartford and Moises Gomez of Springfield). Martinez is also on pace to smash the single-season home runs record for the Fisher Cats. Chip Cannon (2006) and Eric Thames (2010) are tied for the crown with 27 in a season.

STOP HITTING ME: **Zac Cook** has broken the New Hampshire single-season record for hit by pitches with 26. Eric Thames was hit by 18 pitches in 2010, but that was in 573 plate appearances over 130 games. Cook's first 18 hit by pitches came in 139 plate appearances and 36 games. Cook is second in HBP in all the minors, behind Braiden Ward of the Rockies system (28). As far as stats go to 1988, the record for HBP in a season in the minors is 41 (2012). His 26 HBP rank third in Eastern League history.

THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS' HISTORY: August 5, 2007 – The Fisher Cats defeated the Altoona Curve, 10-5, at Blair County Ballpark despite being outhit, 13-12. New Hampshire had seven extra-base hits, none of them homers. Rob Cosby had two of the Cats' six doubles, and center fielder Dustin Majewski had a triple in the seventh. New Hampshire lead, 4-2, after four innings and then scored a pair in the fifth, sixth and seventh. The team was 8-for-18 with runners in scoring position, giving starter Eric Fowler the run support he needed to earn his fourth win of the year. Andrew McCutchen hit his ninth homer of the season for Altoona.

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: Alex Manoah got his 12th win of the season last night, tossing 6.0 innings in Toronto's 9-3 win over Minnesota. He is tied for third in MLB in wins. Bo Bichette was 3-for-5 with two doubles, and both Vlad and Teoscar Hernandez homered. The Jays lead, 3-2, after seven and exploded for six runs in the top of the eighth. Hayden Juenger picked up his first Triple-A save in Buffalo's 7-4 win over Scranton-Wilkes Barre. Vancouver won a pair of 4-3 games over Tri-City. Andres Sosa had a walk-off double in the 10th in game one after it was suspended on Wednesday. Single-A Dunedin split a doubleheader of their own with Lakeland. Trey Cumbie picked up the win in game two, and his Single-A ERA is now 0.56.
