


KEN ABRAMS

TAMMY KNESS


BIOGRAPHY

RONALD MARCUS, M.D.


BIOGRAPHY

Ron Marcus, M.D., is a neuroscience expert with more than 30 years of successful neuroscience drug development experience. At Karuna Therapeutics, he is currently working on a New Drug Application for KarXT in the treatment of schizophrenia. He initiated the ARISE (adjunctive schizophrenia) and ADEPT (psychosis in Alzheimer's Disease) programs while at Karuna.

Prior to joining Karuna, Ron was Chief Medical Officer at Terran Biosciences, a biotech company focusing on a MRI-based imaging diagnostic (using AI), and schizophrenia therapeutics. Dr. Marcus has held executive management positions at several biopharmaceutical companies developing treatments for the central nervous system, including Supernus Pharmaceuticals, Cerecor Inc., and Spinifex Pharmaceuticals. He spent more than 20 years at Bristol-Meyers Squibb (BMS) in senior clinical leadership roles within their Neuroscience division, including Executive Director, Neuroscience Global Clinical Research. In this role, he was the Life Cycle Management Team Leader for Abilify® (aripiprazole), a market-leading antipsychotic, and spearheaded an industry-leading lifecycle management program with more than 20 New Drug Applications (NDA) and supplemental NDAs. The Abilify LCM program has been recognized within the industry for its innovation, strategic and scientific excellence. Dr. Marcus also oversaw the Neuroscience Protocol Review Committee at BMS for more than 20 years, providing rigorous scientific review and input into the study design of approximately 350 clinical trials.

Dr. Marcus received his B.A. in psychology from University of Virginia and M.D. from University at Buffalo (SUNY). He completed his residency in psychiatry at New York Presbyterian-Weill Cornell Medical Center. He has authored more than 90 peer-reviewed publications. He also is an Adjunct Associate Professor Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Johns Hopkins Medical Center.

Lastly, he lives with his son Daniel who has been living with schizophrenia for the past 10 years. He understands from first-hand experience how this disorder impacts families as well as understanding the limitations of current treatment programs in the state of Maryland.



FORREST POINDEXTER, M.A., M.B.A., ED.D.


BIOGRAPHY

In March 2020, Anthony launched Evolving Minds, a mental health nonprofit with a mission to create a culture of care.

Anthony has developed innovative mental health at work programs that center community, connection, and culture-building for nonprofit professionals, educators, social impact organizations, and retail workers. He has also designed mental health programs for students.

Anthony has trained over one thousand program graduates, and his programs have demonstrated compelling impact - including an over 30% reduction in symptoms of depression, anxiety, and stress, and a 50% reduction in absenteeism (employee call outs) and an 89% increase in empathy.

With Evolving Minds, he is committed to building a caring work culture. To make that commitment a reality, has has instituted four-day work weeks, protected weekly time to practice resilience skills such as gratitude, joy, and mindfulness, and established clear work boundaries with technology, with no work or work messages on the weekends.

He currently is a professional speaker with Active Minds, one of the country's leading mental health nonprofits. He sits on the Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility Committee and Board of Directors for Inward Bound Mindfulness Education (iBme), a nationally renowned mindfulness nonprofit. He is also a founding equity team member of Vitalize Care, a Y Combinator-backed start-up, where he designed one of the largest healthcare specific mindfulness learning curricula in the digital mental health space.

his work has been featured in Mental Health America's Workplace Mental Health Toolkit and Mindful Magazine, and he was selected for the 2022 Rising Terp Alumni Excellence Award by the University of Maryland.

Recently, he was showcased in the Change the World Exhibit by the Do Good Institute for his organizing efforts as a student, where he launched a campus-wide campaign, #30DaysTooLate to address the inaccessibility of mental health resources on campus. This campaign inspired the University of Maryland to invest hundreds of thousands of dollars in mental health infrastructure.

He is a graduate of Tara Brach and Jack Kornfield's two-year Mindfulness Meditation Teacher Certification Program, and holds a B.A. in Psychology from the University of Maryland.


Dr. Gia Grier McGinnis has over 15 years' experience in a broad range of areas, including community-university program development, informal environmental education, health equity, and health advocacy.


SHAREESE STRONG

Notably, she assists research and development companies and universities in complying with U.S. export control laws, particularly with respect to technology transfers to foreign national researchers and students.

Linda's practice also encompasses U.S. Customs regulations on imports, including free trade agreements, country-of-origin marketing, valuation, classification, security, transportation issues, domestic preferences and enforcement of intellectual property rights. She resolves complex free trade agreement verifications, seizures, voluntary disclosures, and penalties. Linda has successfully pursued binding rulings, regulatory changes, protests, petitions, and litigation. She also assists clients with tariff matters under Section 301 and Section 232, as well as enforcement of exclusion orders issued by the International Trade Commission under Section 337.

Linda works diligently with her clients to minimize legal spend and maximize efficiency by designing internal international trade systems that make sense to her client's business model. She is most appreciated for her clear answers to complicated and difficult questions.
