Hawaiian quilts are visually amazing and look complex but are very easy to make. I learned to make Hawaiian quilts from Nancy Lee Chong and have become hopelessly addicted, so much so that I purchased Pacific Rim Quilt Company.



3 Day Retreat:

In this 3 day retreat you will work on a favorite Pacific Rim Quilt Company Hawaiian wall quilt pattern. You will have hands on experience cutting and basting your quilt. Then you will learn needleturn appliqué techniques on a practice piece or on your quilt if you choose. We will have time to discuss the next steps, quilting and finishing your wall hanging.

All skill levels welcome. No machines needed!

Supply List:

- *Hawaiian Quilt Wall Pattern:* Purchase the Tulip Vases Hawaiian wall hanging pattern from Pacific Rim Quilt Company

- *Bring two contrasting fabrics:* Quantity according to the Fabric Requirements on the back of the pattern. (100% cotton)
 - Both fabrics should be solid or nearly-solid colors. Choose two colors with strong contrasting values. They may be light and dark of the same color or two different colors.
 - You can also purchase a kit to take out the guess work. Kits are available here: <https://pacificrimquilt.com/hawaiiankits/>
- *Practice fabrics:* Two 12" square pieces of contrasting fabrics. These will be used to practice the needleturn techniques
- *Milliners/Straw Needles* size 10 or 11

- *Needle for basting*
- *Thread for Appliqué:* that matches your appliqué fabric.
- *Thread for basting:* color not important
- *Thread snippers and paper scissors*
- *Fabric shears:* good enough to cut through 8 layers of fabric. 8" Gingher shears or equivalent.
- *Straight pins*
- *Pencil or pen:* Permanent or temporary (no ball-point pens)
- *Masking tape:* Not blue painters tape
- Optional items: reading glasses, needle threader, portable light
