The ZOOM Meeting was called to order at 6:32 pm by Carol Lamp.

Pastor gave a devotion and asked for prayer requests.

The Meeting Agenda was approved.
April minutes were approved.

Monthly Reports:

- Pastor Kurt's written report was submitted.
- Christian Education written report was submitted
- BASICS written report was submitted
- Property written report was submitted
- Stewardship written report was submitted
- Office Manager written report was submitted
- Weekly contributions continue to be on budget
- Financial Reports were submitted.
 - ◇ The budget is still looking good, we are covering our expenses month to month with contributions. However, as we return to worship and the staff returns to work, we may need to fine tune some budget areas.
 - ◇ The council has decided to start a Reserve Fund. This fund will be used for

future expenses related to the building and the property. We have transferred \$10,000 from our checking account to the Reserve Fund and hope to eventually have a reserve of \$50,000.

Old Business:

- The Re-opening task force has been disbanded. The church is now open for services and for small group and committee meetings. If you are interested in having a meeting at a church, please let the office know. They will make arrangements to have the doors open for you. Please clean up (sanitize the area you use) practice safe CDC recommendations (social distancing and mask wearing) and do not use the kitchen area.
- If you are interested in Ushering or Greeting, please contact the office, we will need more Ushers for in person services.
- The Job Description for the new Full Time Youth and Family Coordinator has been submitted to Crossways Camps and to the Synod Office. If you are interested or know someone who is, contact the office. We are reposting the position again, hopefully interviewing will occur soon and we will have someone in place by the end of summer
- The AV project installation has been completed; it is working great for all services. A very special thank you to John Stangel for his efforts to complete this project on budget.

New Business:

- Joel DeShaney has obtained quotes for resurfacing the parking

lots and has contacted the neighboring Assisted Living facility to access their interest in completing the parking lots at the same time. They are interested and we are hoping to see some quotes for project soon.

- Volunteers have started to mow the grass again this year. Please contact the office if you are interested in helping.
- Joel held a spring clean-up day on May 1st. We had a nice group help clean up the property, trim bushes, plant flowers, etc. The property is looking great. Thank you Joel, you had a busy month!
- The Synod Assembly was held May 15th, Our Saviour's contributed \$300 to the Synod for this event.
- We are hoping to lift restrictions on the number of people in attendance at the indoor services soon. We will also be stopping the parking service once interest dies down.
- Committee reports will now be included with the minutes in communications to the members.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
We adjourned at 8:40.
