Rebirth and Renewal

Greetings to you all as we enter the month of May,

We continue to celebrate Easter as we remember Christ's resurrection and victory over death. We know the promise of the forgiveness of our sin and life everlasting. As Easter people we proclaim the gospel and participate in the sacraments. This month our High School Freshmen will affirm their Baptisms during Confirmation Worship on May 5th.

May this be a time for all of us to remember our own Baptisms by pondering Luther's Small Catechism in which he writes:

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM

I *What is baptism?*

Baptism is not simply plain water. Instead, it is water used according to God's command and connected with God's word.

What then is this word of God?

Where our Lord Christ says in Matthew 28, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

II *What gifts or benefits does baptism grant?*

It brings about forgiveness of sins, redeems from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe it, as the words and promise of God declare.

What are these words and promise of God?

Where our Lord Christ says in Mark 16, "The one who believes and is baptized will be saved; but the one who does not believe will be condemned."

*continued from front page***III How can water do such great things?**

Clearly the water does not do it, but the word of God, which is with and alongside the water, and faith, which trusts this word of God in the water. For without the word of God the water is plain water and not a baptism, but with the word of God it is a baptism, that is, a grace-filled water of life and a "bath of the new birth in the Holy Spirit," as St. Paul says to Titus in chapter 3, "through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. This Spirit he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. The saying is sure."

IV What then is the significance of such a baptism with water?

It signifies that the old person in us with all sins and evil desires is to be drowned and die through daily sorrow for sin and through

repentance, and on the other hand that daily a new person is to come forth and rise up to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

Where is this written?

St. Paul says in Romans 6, "We were buried with Christ through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life."

On a day to day basis I must say that section IV is of personal comfort to me because it gives me hope as well as the promise of a new beginning each and every day.

MISSION QUILTS

SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- LWR Mission Quilts should measure approximately 60" x 80". This size best serves adult

recipients and children as they grow older. Please donate only 60" x 80" quilts.

- The ultimate purpose of a quilt is to provide warmth, so please choose your fabrics accordingly. Even in warmer climates, temperatures can drop dramatically at night.
- Quilt tops and bottoms can be made from whole pieces of fabric or any type of patchwork pattern or smaller squares. Twelve 21" or forty-eight 11" squares sewn together using a 1/2" seam allowance make a 60" X 80" top. Cut or sew bottoms 64" X 84" as this allows for a required edging on the quilt.
- Keeping in mind that LWR quilts will be washed frequently and used for many purposes, we recommend sturdy, washable fabrics such as cotton, cotton blends, twill, corduroy, and polyester knits. Please ensure that there are no stains or holes before using fabrics in a quilt.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your congregation's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.



Gas Station Gift Cards

Pillars provides gas station gift cards to individuals and families who are accessing our supportive and case management services. These help them keep their vehicles fueled so they can make it to appointments, job interviews, and other meetings or referrals.

Gas station gift cards also help Pillars keep their own vehicles fueled. Pillars has vehicles that help transport people from Pillars Adult Shelter to Pillars Resource Center, that help us transport large donations, and that Pillars uses to help move people into their own housing.

Gift cards most often used: Kwik Trip

Grocery Store Gift Cards

Pillars provides individuals and families who are exiting shelter to move into their own homes with grocery store gift cards to help them get started in their new home.

Pillars also uses grocery store gift cards to assist in purchasing groceries for Pillars Adult Shelter and Pillars Adult & Family Shelter, where meals are served on a daily basis to 140 people.

Retail Store Gift Cards

Pillars provides individuals and families who are exiting shelter to move into their own homes with retail store gift cards to help them get started in their new home.

Subject: Crossways Camping Ministries Annual Meeting 2018 Report

Mission Statement: "Bringing people together in Christ so lives are changed and communities enhanced."

The Annual meeting was held March 2, 2019 at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Neenah. Crossways Lutheran Camping Ministry supports the faith formation of youth and adults from over 115 congregations in the East Central, Greater Milwaukee and South Central ELCA Synods of WI. Crossways is a multi-site outdoor ministry organization rooted in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), offering year-round faith-based programming for children, youth, families, and adults in northeastern Wisconsin. Several of the highlights from the meeting (Annual report attached):


- The three-year Crossways Capital Campaign moved from an individual phase to a congregational phase, with over 57 congregations participating. Over 100 individuals previously contributed to the Crossway's "Rooted in Faith, Growing to Serve" campaign. Crossways has received a total of \$672,029 in pledges and one-time gifts as of Feb 13—40% of the \$1.8 million goal. From the Crossways website: "It is time to upgrade our facilities and program equipment/supplies so we can expand our year-round efforts to provide a quality experience for all our campers and guests. For example, upgrades to our dining room and kitchen at all three sites will enable us to better serve our summer and second season (September – May) campers and guests. Enhancements will help us meet those needs on a year-round basis at Imago Dei Village, Pine Lake and Waypost."
- 2018 was transition year for senior staff. Crossways currently undergoing search for new Executive Director to replace the Interim Executive Director. Pine Lake and Waypost Camps experienced turnover in directors. New program director at Imago Dei Village.
- Youth camperships remained relatively steady but Crossways is hopeful that increased emphasis on marketing and education will result in larger youth camp attendance.
- Crossways financial situation is stable. Though they retired a nearly \$1 million long-term loan several years ago, they still carry approximately \$350,000 in short-term and revolving debt.
- Lutheran Outdoor Ministry Network was invited by the Board of Directors of Crossways to evaluate the entire Crossways Ministry. The purpose of this Consultation Team was to review the current operations of Crossways and to make recommendations to the Board regarding the same. The team was asked to focus primarily, though not exclusively, on staff structures, financial management, and the unique situations that multi-site organizations experience. It was felt that this interim time for the organization was an optimal time for this consultation and would be helpful to the board as it sought a new executive director. Some highlights from recommendations:
 1. The board, along with the staff, should continue to work toward standardizing reporting, financial (i. e., income and expenses) as well as occupancy, usage, and rates charged and how they all work together to impact the ongoing financial status of Crossways.
 2. Crossways is a multi-site organization (Pine Lake, Image Dei Village, and Waypost) that have their own unique role to play, requiring a different emphasis on the budget and staff needed to execute programs.
- 2019 theme is "Please bring relationships with us." Reconnecting, rebuilding, and deepening relationships to help Crossways realize even greater opportunities to partner in ministry.
