



Our Saviour's is committed to Crossways Camping Ministries

Throughout the month of January, Our Saviour's will be highlighting and informing our members about Crossways Camping Ministry—our outdoor ministry partner. There will be videos, temple talks from our members about the various youth and adult programs, bulletin inserts, displays, an information table, culminating with a guest speaker followed by a Spaghetti Feast dinner on January 27. Members will also be given an opportunity to donate to the Crossways Capital Campaign—their first capital campaign in 27 years. Crossways has set a goal of raising 1.8 million and Our Saviour's, along with other ELCA congregations will be participating in this capital campaign.

The Capital Campaign will be used to upgrade existing facilities and to further develop year-round ministry and rental opportunities. Our Saviour's has set a 3-year, non-binding goal of raising \$10,000 to help meet Crossway's goal. Members will be given an opportunity to donate via several means. We will have a “Cash for Crossways” tent set up in the Narthex for folks to donate their coins, cash, or checks. We will also have intent pledge cards available at our Crossways information table in the Narthex. Members can spread out their pledge over three years on these intent cards.

Our own award winning chef, Larry Williams, will be preparing an all-you-can-eat CELEBRATION Spaghetti Feast. The feast will be held on January 27 at 11:30 in the Fellowship Hall. Along with Spaghetti, there will be salad, garlic bread, beverages, and desserts. Spaghetti Feast tickets will be on sale at our Crossway Narthex table on Thursdays and Sundays throughout January. Tickets will be \$10 for adults and \$5 for kids 12 and under. All proceeds go to supporting the Crossways Capital Campaign.

We encourage you to prayerfully consider supporting Crossways financially during this month. We also encourage you to consider attending one of Crossways many camps and retreats this year. Crossways recently celebrated their 75th anniversary in serving Christ and continues to be “Rooted in Faith and Growing to Serve.” Help ensure Crossways remains a vibrant outdoor ministry for our youth and adults well into the future.
