The annual meeting was held March 14, 2020 at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Neenah. Crossways Lutheran Camping Ministry supports the faith formation of youth and adults from over 115 congregations in the East Central, Greater Milwaukee and South Central ELCA Synods of WI. Crossways is a multi-site outdoor ministry organization rooted in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), offering year-round faith-based programming for children, youth, families, and adults in northeastern Wisconsin. Due to the Covid-19 Virus, our meeting was limited in depth and time along with practicing social distancing. Several of the highlights from the meeting:

- There was an actual shortfall of \$92,528 for 2019. Projected 2020 shortfall is \$94,263.
- Program revenue was short—contributions were less. Reason: Perhaps more funds directed to the Crossways Capital Campaign.

- Camps fully staffed for 2020 (was not previously). Waypost Camp was dormant in 2019 due to lack of Director being in place. Anticipate more revenue due to being fully staffed and all three camps open and running.
- Anticipate more revenue from grants.
- Previous line of credit and outstanding short-term loan were consolidated with an additional amount added to that to address the projected shortfall. The new \$150,000 line of credit was approved for 2020 operations. All outstanding lines of credit are to be paid off by end of the year as directed by the by-laws.

Summary: Overall the 2020 outlook appears promising despite the on-going Covid-19 virus. Program revenue to date is up this time of year compared to similar time in 2019.




