A word from Pastor Ramon Smith



This article aims to share the church's mission and how we have been working towards accomplishing the mission over the past two years. It will also include some new developments involving our church staff. The mission is "to make (develop) disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." The mission is based on the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20).

From the summer of 2021 through the Fall, our primary focus was resuming fruitful ministries and events that had gone

dormant during the pandemic. The focus of 2022-2023 was addressing the infrastructure needs necessary to improve our worship and discipleship experiences on campus. In 2023, we will focus on rebuilding our staff and implementing a new discipleship plan. In the past, the church has had a Visitation Director and a Holy Focus Director (Saginaw Water Project), and a pastor who oversaw these two positions. Those positions still need to be filled.

Additionally, Nathaniel Metz, who has served as the ministry and media assistant, has been accepted into the Ph.D. program for religious studies at Baylor University. Baylor has also given him a teaching assistant position, and Nathaniel will no longer work for our church. However, Nathaniel will remain a Saginaw United Methodist Church member, and we are excited for him as he pursues his calling in academia.

Due to the loss of staff, it is necessary to rebuild our staff infrastructure to accomplish the church's mission. Other than the work of the Triune God, people are our most excellent resource. We need qualified staff to fill the vacancies and more volunteers. Therefore, in consultation with me, the Staff Parrish Relations Committee has developed a plan of consolidation and realignment to address our staffing needs.

The conference offered to help Saginaw United Methodist Church address our staffing needs by offering a full-time associate pastor for appointment to our church. The fulltime associate pastor will primarily be responsible for Caring Ministries, including the Saginaw Water Project, Pastoral Care, and Missional Outreach. In addition, the associate pastor will focus on building a base of volunteers for the visitation ministry, providing pastoral leadership to and making referrals for Stephen Ministers, and helping align our mission activities to make a more significant impact on our community. The associate will also help with Sunday morning worship service leadership, preaching, and the consecration of the sacraments.

The senior pastor will remain involved in pastoral care, but the associate would be the primary contact. I will remain the lead for planning weddings and funerals. I will continue to make communion visits. In addition, I will devote more time to the committees working on our vision (with Discernment and Administrative Council), project outcome management, training laity for leadership (alongside the nominations and leadership development committee), evangelism, fostering relationships with families, working alongside other churches in the community, and discipleship.

Since Nathaniel also served as our media assistant, we needed to fill that position. The media assistant is responsible for maintaining the website, and social media posts on Facebook, editing videos, creating designs for signage, and creating worship presentations (the slides). SPRC has hired Samantha Hess, a highly qualified person with years of experience in church media. She will primarily work remotely. You can reach her at media@saginawumc.org.

The staff parish relations committee consulted with the finance concerning the financial impact of these staff changes for 2023. These new hires will result in very little change to the overall SPRC budget. These changes will enable us to provide better care for our current members and implement a plan of growth to attract and disciple new people. The name of the new associate pastor will be announced on Sunday, May 14, 2023. I am excited about the future of our church! Thank you for serving God, the church, and the community.

Save the Date!

We will be touring the famous "Top O' Hill Terrace" in Arlington on **Saturday, June 24th**. Originally built as a tearoom and restaurant, the "Top O' Hill" gained notoriety when it was sold and turned into an illegal gambling establishment in the 1920s. Escape tunnels and secret rooms were added to hide the gambling paraphernalia during raids. The tearoom and restaurant, both legitimate businesses, operated beside the casino, as well as a brothel. Years later the casino would be raided and shut down. It was later purchased by the Bible Baptist Seminary and operates today as the Arlington Baptist Seminary. Tickets are \$10 each and spots are limited! The tour is scheduled for 1 pm. It is a 2 hour tour. We will meet for lunch prior to the tour. 

This is Part 3 in a series of articles on church leadership opportunities.

If you are new to the church, or just interested in knowing more about how it runs, this series of newsletter articles are especially for you. The Nominations and Leadership Development Committee hopes to inform and educate the congregation, and perhaps spark interest in your participation in an area of the church that especially speaks to your gifts and talents.

What is the Board of Trustees?

This board supervises and maintains all property belonging to the congregation of the local church. The Trustees have several legal and administrative functions: 1) Oversee, maintain, and supervise church property (including the parsonage) and perform annual inspections and inventory; 2) Create and administer a five-year capital expense plan. This plan summarizes the large-dollar maintenance requirements the church will need to complete. It is updated annually and shared with the Finance Committee and Administrative Council; 3) Report annually to the charge conference on the state of property, equipment, investments, and resources; 4) Receive and administer all gifts made to the congregation and develop guidelines for this purpose; 5) Ensure that the articles of incorporation are up to date; 6) Be responsible, with the pastor, for the use of the church building and grounds; 7) Maintain adequate insurance coverage; 8) Submit requests to the Finance Committee's annual budget and be accountable to the charge conference and Administrative Council.

On this committee, 1/3 of members do not have to be members of the church. There should be at least 1/3 laywomen and 1/3 laymen. Members generally serve in the class structure of three-year rotations for continuity. Current members are: Ken Sipll (Chair), Londa Pontius, Gary Hill, Ron Mayo, Linda Allison, David White, Amber Haltom, Robert Pressler and Jerry Avery.

What is the Finance Committee?

The role of this committee is to raise, manage and disperse the finances for the congregation so that the stated mission is achieved. They follow the Wesleyan Method of financial leadership to balance "fundraising" with the conceptual discipline of stewardship. The main tasks of this committee are: 1) Provides financial direction; 2) Recommend an annual budget to support the church mission and ministries and develops an annual funding program; 3) Arranges for an annual audit of financial records; 4) Provides financial communication and reports; 5) Nurtures growth in giving and generosity.

According to the Discipline, the Finance Committee is primarily comprised of persons linked to this committee by their leadership role on other committees. This group currently includes: Dale Pontius, Finance Chair; Ramon Smith, Pastor; Sam Thompson, Lay Member of Annual Conference; Rosa Jordan, Administrative Council Chair; Diane Weaver, Treasurer; Juanita Jordan, Lay Leader; Sandy Thompson, SPRC Chair; Ken Sipll, Trustees Chair; Don King, Endowment Chair; Tim Kret, Stewardship; Jennifer McIntyre, Office & Financial Administrator; Phyllis Rainone, Financial Secretary; Mike Dodyk, Tom Griffith, and Lou Ann Pressler.

Opportunities to Serve

I would like to take a moment to thank everyone who generously donated pillows and blankets to the Friends of Lancaster ministry, which serves the homeless in the Fort Worth area. The people who received the pillows and blankets were very appreciative.

However, the homeless population in Fort Worth is growing. Our group is running out of food and water each time we serve. The need is greater than amounts of food and water that we can provide. We are serving approximately 200 people each month.


