Dear Family of God,

As Christians we are story tellers. We have an ancient narrative, one that describes the beginning of time and the relationship between God and God's Creation. We see this story grow through the prophetic tradition until our story recounts the life and gifts of the Son of God. But the story doesn't end with the Resurrection just as it did not end with the Cross, it continues on in each of us today as we encounter and are transformed by the Good News.

Luke's Gospel is bookended by the animated story-telling of two women named Mary. Early in the Gospel, Mary the mother of Jesus, tells us of her encounter with the Divine who informs her that she will bear a child who will change the world.. She proclaims her joy: "Tell out my soul! The Greatness of the Lord!" At the end of the Gospel, another Mary, Mary Magdalene, visits the tomb to discover it empty and receives instructions from the Risen Christ to go tell the others. She carries this Good News with jubilance to the Disciples.

What is your Good News; the idea, dream, challenge placed in your heart by God, that needs to be shared? What is the ministry to which you are called which will change the world, sharing your talents, gifts, and love with your neighbors?

Our Stewardship Campaign this year focuses on these stories - the ones inside you, the ones you are still writing, the ones we tell about those who have gone before us. We are all a part of this ongoing narrative - the ongoing Creation. As you pray about how you will share your gifts with us this year, think about how God is calling you to tell out your soul, to spread the Good News far and wide. Hear the stories that we share weekly throughout the campaign that relate the creative spark in us with the ways in which we are called to serve God and love our neighbor.

Tell out my soul! The Greatness of the Lord!





LINCOLN SCHOOLS

Our support of Lincoln School began in earnest seven years ago. The focus school supplies, personal care items followed by clothing. It was not until the following year (2020) food was added. Today it is the major focus. Changes in school funding have resulted in Lincoln School having only two primary sources for food outside that served in the cafeteria. Lincoln has access to a food grant through Second Harvest Food Bank. The school orders food from a list of items offered through the Food Bank. The list varies based upon the food items Second Harvest can purchase from its suppliers. Christ Episcopal Church has a Lincoln outreach fund and is also supported with donations of food, clothing and personal care items and money from our parishioners. There are no additional funding sources.

For the first time ever there is a pressing need for ALL items – food, clothing and personal care items.

The Community Liaison shared information she had heard on the news this morning (9/22). Warren Ohio has the most children living impoverished in the state of Ohio.

Tribune Chronicle excerpts:

The Valley's two biggest cities — Warren and Youngstown — are at the top of the list of the worst cities in Ohio when it comes to childhood poverty, according to estimates from the U.S. Census Bureau.

In Warren, an astounding 56.7% of children live in poverty. In Youngstown, the figure is 51.3%. Portsmouth (50.1%) and East Cleveland (49.8%) round out the top four. (Warren holds first place)

Childhood poverty is defined by the number of people 17 and under who live under the poverty level based on household income. In 2024, that standard was \$31,200 for a family of four with two children.

This means that children are deprived of the necessary resources they need to grow into adults who are healthy, educated and able to independently sustain their well-being.

The hope is that incoming manufacturing and other jobs — particularly in Trumbull County — can bring down the childhood poverty numbers in the region. The overall poverty rate here also may improve.

But those future jobs and paychecks won't feed and clothe our children or provide proper health care today or next week. That's why we must continue to support churches, organizations and schools that do what they can to fill the gaps in children's lives.
