A Message from Mother Robin



Dear Friends,

November has been packed full of meaningful moments in the life of our parish—moments that have strengthened our community, deepened our faith, and prepared our hearts for the road ahead.

We began with All Saints Sunday and a deeply moving Candlelight Compline in the evening.

Stewardship Sunday was held on November 16th, a time when we reflected on God's generosity and our call to respond with grateful and faithful hearts.

That same spirit of generosity was beautifully evident in the Thanksgiving baskets prepared for families at Lincoln School. Because of your kind and abundant donations, several families were able to enjoy a fuller, happier holiday meal.

I, along with Bob Johnston and John Panagis, attended the 209th Diocesan Convention, where I was honored to be elected as clergy representative to the Diocesan Council and appointed as Dean of the Southeast Mission Area. These roles are not mine alone—they are opportunities for Christ Church to have a voice and presence in the wider diocesan community. I look forward to serving in ways that strengthen our congregation and foster collaboration among our neighboring churches.

This month also brought joyful opportunities for fellowship. 14 men gathered at Salvatore's for brunch, and 22 women met at Café 422, sharing stories, encouragement, and the simple gift of being together. These gatherings remind us that the church isn't just what happens in the sanctuary on Sunday, it's the relationships we nurture and the community we build throughout the week.

In addition, I had the privilege of serving as Chaplain for the Episcopal Church Women (ECW) retreat at Bellwether. It was a beautiful time of prayer, reflection, and renewal, and I'm grateful to have represented Christ Church in this ministry of presence.

As we come to the end of November, we find ourselves standing at a threshold. The liturgical year concludes with Christ the King Sunday, a day that reminds us that the One we follow


WE NEED COOKIES

Maintenance discussions centered around:

- exploring potential for new boiler
- implementing all new interior keys (see Tiffany if you have old interior keys)

Day care communication always remains open and productive as we continue to work through effective processes for kitchen and parish hall use. With the focus on keeping the little people safe, we continue to explore options to gain more day time, especially in the kitchen. Discussion occurred regarding the need for Diocesan training for safe church policies as well as background check. More discussion on these processes will occur, with definitive policy put into place as we move forward.
