A Message from Mother Robin



February invites us to hold two sacred movements together: remembrance and repentance, celebration and self-examination. As we honor Black History Month and prepare to enter Lent, we are reminded that faith is not only about what we believe, but how we remember, turn, and live.

Black History Month is a holy act of truth-telling. The stories of Black leaders, communities, and faithful witnesses, many who labored in the face of injustice, reveal God's liberating work in the world. From spirituals sung in hope, to prophets who marched, preached, and organized, Black history is deeply woven into the life of the Church.

One way we live into this remembrance is through worship. I invite you to the annual Festal Eucharist honoring the Rev. Absalom Jones and the Rt. Rev. Barbara Clementine Harris on February 14 at 11:00 a.m. at Christ Church, Shaker Heights. Hosted by the Wilma Ruth Combs Northeast Chapter of the Union of Black Episcopalians, the Diocese of Ohio, and Christ Church, this liturgy bears powerful witness to faith, perseverance, and leadership.

As we give thanks for resilience and courage, we also acknowledge where the Church has fallen short of the Gospel's call to justice and love. Honest remembrance is a spiritual practice that opens the door to healing.

This prepares us for Lent, which begins with Ash Wednesday on February 18. Lent is not about guilt, but about truth that leads to freedom. It is a season of returning—returning to God, to our neighbors, and to the heart of the Gospel.

Holding Black History Month and Lent together reminds us that repentance is both personal and communal, calling us to live our baptismal promises with integrity.

As we move through February, may we remember faithfully, repent honestly, and hope boldly, walking together in the way of Jesus.



The Rev. Absalom Jones/Bishop Barbara Harris Holy Eucharist

On **February 14 at 11:00 a.m.** at Christ Church, Shaker Heights, the Wilma Ruth Combs Northeast Chapter of the Union of Black Episcopalians, in collaboration with the Diocese of Ohio and Christ Church, will host the annual Festal Eucharist celebrating the Rev. Absalom Jones and the Rt. Rev. Barbara Clementine Harris. Jones was the first African American ordained as a priest in the Episcopal Church, and Harris the first woman consecrated as a bishop in the Anglican Communion.

The Rt. Rev. Anne B. Jolly will be the celebrant, and the Rev. Megan Allen-Miller will be the preacher. All are welcome to join in the celebration of these inspirational clergy, whose lives and ministries have left a profound impact on the church's communal life and ministry.

Your presence matters — we need a quorum in order to hold elections and vote on parish matters.





UNDERSTANDING THE LORDS PRAYER

Sometimes I get stuck trying to pray. I am not always sure how to pray. I have had people tell me to tell God what's on my heart. Just speak to him, and usually that's what I end up doing, but I listened to a man talk about how he prays every morning, and I LIKE IT!

He said that Jesus didn't leave us guessing. He gave us the blueprint. One of the first things that he does every morning is he gets out of bed, immediately kneels down and he prays the Lords prayer. He doesn't do it because it's a magic formula, and not because he is trying to check a box, but because Jesus himself said pray like this. He also didn't say to repeat this mindlessly, but let your heart guide the words to the prayer. He then proceeded to walk through what Jesus actually meant when this prayer was recited.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. From the very first sentence Jesus shifts our focus. We aren't praying to the universe or talking to an idea. We are speaking to a Father. We are personal, present and loving. The first thing we do is we honor him. We worship him. We remember who he is before we talk about what we need. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. This is where it gets really good. I usually pray for my own plans, goals or outcomes. Jesus teaches us to lay all of that down. He teaches us that its his will. Not mine. Not an easy concept because we all seem to want to tell Jesus what we want and what we need. This is where we have to surrender to him. Show discipleship. It's faith in action. Give us today our daily bread. This is daily, not weekly or monthly. It's not give me everything I want right now so I don't need you. It's about total dependency on Jesus. Trusting the process because it came from him. Leaning on God for what you need today. You don't want to be consumed by tomorrow. Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. This is a hard one to do. We ask God for mercy, but struggle to give mercy to others. We can't follow Jesus while holding on to bitterness. Forgiveness is not optional. It's freedom.


Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. This is like a battle prayer. It's acknowledging spiritual warfare. It's actually saying God I can't fight this on my own. He needs to keep my feet steady and guard my mind. Protect my heart. I have to ask God for this because the enemy is real. Temptation is real. But through all of this God has the power to deliver.

So why should we pray this every morning? It resets my heart, acknowledges God, and puts him first. It also reminds me that following God isn't about some fancy words I say to him, but it's about humility, obedience, dependence, forgiveness. The Lord's prayer is Jesus saying here, start here. It's not the only way to pray, but it's a good foundation, and when you understand what you are praying for, your prayers make all the difference in the world.

Thank him, praise him. He wants to be needed. Jesus wants to be your savior.


We don't need to know what the specific issue is, but we want to let them know we are thinking about them.
