Suturing techniques of simple interrupted, running, horizontal and vertical mattress3. Practice elliptical excision and suture using pigs' feet	Table D: Cryotherapy, Wound care <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Review of lesions requiring cryotherapy and reminder stages of ulceration2. Practice cryotherapy with cryo gun3. Wound types, stages of ulceration4. Review wound care supplies with discussion about use
