## C. QUESTIONS TO PONDER

1. **What is one thing you are waiting for? Why is it difficult to wait when you want something that seems far off? Accept and affirm all thoughtful answers. Human nature, especially in modern times, leans toward instant gratification.**
2. **What is one thing you worried about lately? A move? A tough choice? A relationship? How did you handle the worry? Were you frightened? Did you pray? Looking back, how did God help you through it? Accept and affirm all thoughtful answers.**

## D. TERMS OF THE WEEK

Review these key terms and write definitions.

**Moses:** An Israelite whom God chose to set the Hebrew slaves free and to bring them to the Promised Land.

**Promised Land:** The land promised to Abraham for his descendants. Modern Israel.

**David:** The great king of Israel from 1000 - 962 B.C. and writer of many of the psalms.

**Solomon:** David's son, the third king of Israel, and builder of the temple in Jerusalem.

**Covenant:** A binding agreement between God and God's people.

**Blessing:** The ceremonial passing on of God's promised favor from father to son.
