FOCUS THIS WEEK

Abraham and Sarah were called from their homes to a cloudy future. They had next to nothing—no land, and no people to their name. They couldn't have children of their own. with some of the following.

A. IMAGES IN WORDS AND ART

Take a look at the theme art. What do you see in the art? Where are you in the art? How might the art apply to the theme verse?

B. ROLE PLAY

- 1. Your best friend's family is moving 1000 miles away. The kids in the family are depressed and afraid about the move. What do you say?
- 2. A friend's mother just died from cancer. "I think God has abandoned me," she says. What do you say to her? Where is God in all of this?



C. QUESTIONS TO PONDER

- 1. Have you ever had to leave something familiar and comfortable, and move into something you didn't know? Have you ever had to move to a new city, change schools, change homes or parents, or friends? What was it like? Accept and affirm all thoughtful answers.
- 2. Have you ever felt God calling you to go somewhere, do something to help someone, or say something to defend someone?

 Describe the situation. Accept and affirm all thoughtful answers. Share your own story. If students can't think of situations, ask them if they have ever witnessed someone being mistreated. Have they seen garbage thrown on the highway? Do they have friends who don't go to church? In each of these situations, God may be tugging at their hearts to do or say something. Are they listening?
- 3. When you are in trouble, are you more likely to pray: "God, get me out of it," or "God, get me through it"? Why? Which prayer will result in more personal growth? Why? Accept and affirm all thoughtful answers. The second prayer leads us to peace in tough times and personal growth.
- **D. TERMS OF THE WEEK** Review these key terms and write definitions.

Abraham (Abram): Father of Isaac and the Jewish people, chosen by God to follow the promise.

Covenant: A binding agreement between God and God's people.

Blessing: The ceremonial passing on of God's promised favor from father to son.

Isaac: Child of the promise, given to Abraham and Sarah in old age. Means "laughter."

Sarah (Sarai): Mother of Isaac and the Jewish people, chosen by God to follow the promise
