Participation in USABILITY Study:

- **Who?** General education elementary students in 4th through 6th grade who have little to no experience with school-based SEL programs.
- **When?** Single virtual testing session(s) inside or outside of school hours as indicated by needs/policies.
- **What will your child do?**
 - Testing: In a group setting, share their thoughts as they engage with a series of scenarios about 2 SEL programs and work with other participants (approximately 2 hours).
 - Surveys: Complete brief surveys to provide additional input (approximately 10 minutes).
- **Incentive?** \$200 gift card as a thank you for your child's participation.
