## Maternal Child and Adolescent Health (MCAH)

- Maternal Child and Adolescent Health convened two round table forums attended by community partners across several agencies and provider groups.
  - The first focused on equitable access to perinatal care throughout the County. Subcommittees were formed to address regional needs in Coastal and North County communities. The North County group is working with Public Health on a Health and Human Services Office of Minority Health grant in partnership with Round Valley Indian Health Center, FIRST 5, Mendocino Community Health Clinics and the Adventist Health residency program.
  - The second forum, convened through the Children's Health Committee in partnership with Healthy Mendocino, focused on Adolescent Health and Reproductive Health Education. Public Health is working with partners Planned Parenthood Northern California, Mendocino County Office of Education and Mendocino Coast Clinics Blue Door Clinic, among others, to expand this conversation to develop local California Healthy Youth Act resources.
  - MCAH is rolling out Public Health's Child Passenger Safety program. This week we are hosting a child passenger safety technician training that will create 11 new techs ready to ensure seats are correctly fitted throughout the County.
