



July 2025 – CEO REPORT

I. Effective County Government Organization

- The Department is continuing to conduct random Priority Inspections and will visit 5% of all CCBL sites enrolled in the program by the end of the cultivation season.

II. A Safe and Healthy County

- In June 2025, MCD began contacting CCBL holders who were issued with a Compliance Plan to ensure they were on track with completing all items as outlined in Exhibit A of their plan. To date, 41 compliance plans have been successfully closed out. MCD has reached out to 50 CCBL holders with outstanding compliance plans and is in process of contacting the remaining 271 CCBL holders. Due to the March 2024 Mendocino Cannabis Cultivation Ordinance updates, the Department can grant one-year extension to the term of a Compliance Plan, provided the CCBL holder demonstrates good faith efforts toward achieving full compliance.

III. A Thriving Economy

- There are now 575 annual state licenses issued in Mendocino County, only 16 provisional licenses remain.
- MCD's current LEEP grant provides up to \$50,000 in funding for business expenses to support eligible cannabis businesses. This grant program is currently in progress, and the Department anticipates being able to fund an additional 2 direct grants already in queue with the current round of funding.
