S.661 will require Customs and Border Protection (CBD) to develop guidelines for the treatment of children in custody, which includes the provision of basic necessities. It will also require CBD to assign licensed child welfare professionals to identify victims of trafficking and ensure provisions are made to prevent family separation by assisting in reuniting separated families.
