#### A Message From The Finance Council

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

As members of your Finance Council, we provide parishioner oversight of our parish and school finances. We want to make you aware of a change in parish collections that has given us a cause for concern. The parish did very well financially in the fiscal year of 2017-2018 (ending June 30, 2018), with steady, solid growth in our income. But, beginning in July, our ordinary income (Sunday collections and online giving) began to decline.

During the first four months of the new fiscal year (July-October) our ordinary income, compared to last year, is down \$12,943 (or -4.3%). We are concerned about the trendline. In this transitional year, as we head toward new parish leadership, we think it is important to keep the parish on sound financial footing. We realize that there may be a variety of reasons for the decline in giving, but we feel it is our duty to provide you with the information, so that you may consider it. Thank you for all you do to make Our Lady of Guadalupe a vibrant parish.
