In 2017, President Trump announced the U.S. would withdraw from the Paris Agreement, an international treaty signed by the U.S. and 193 other nations to address climate change. The U.S. Catholic Bishops responded saying that they, "along with Pope Francis and the entire Catholic Church, have consistently upheld the Paris Agreement as an important international mechanism to promote environmental stewardship and encourage climate change mitigation. The President's decision not to honor the U.S. commitment to the Paris Agreement is deeply troubling."
