Urge Your Senators to Advance the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act

As Catholics, we are deeply committed to building economies that put people before profits. The Pregnant Workers Fairness Act (S. 1486) would make the workplace safer for pregnant workers and their unborn children by requiring employers to provide pregnant employees with reasonable accommodations, such as a chair for jobs that require long periods of standing, light lifting only, being able to carry a water bottle, and permission take additional bathroom breaks.
