Urge Your Senators to Support the Dream Act of 2019

Call on your Senators to support the Dream Act of 2019 (S.874). The bill, which has already passed the House, gives Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) recipients, along with Temporary Protected Status (TPS) holders, and Deferred Enforcement Departure (DED) holders a pathway to citizenship. DACA recipients have lived in U.S. for an average of 20 years and they, along with their households, pay \$8.8 billion in tax dollars. Call on your Senators to bring S. 874 to the floor for a vote to provide protection from deportation and stability to the young, undocumented members of our society who are seeking work and education.
