Daren – let committee/coaches know EDC would like to be as helpful as possible, but given the number of students at EDC now, we need as much support as possible from parents and coaches to help kids get from EDC to CYO practices/events.

Help us help you.

- **From Sport liason:** EDC get a schedule for practices and picture day.
- **From Coach:** (1) Communicate to EDC who and when they will pick up children so we can remind students to get ready on time. (2) Assist EDC in make sure kids get ready
- **From Parents:** (1) Parents give EDC written notice that coach will pick up – forms avail at edc. (2) Parents communicate with coach pick up child. (3) Make sure the student knows it is their responsibility to get dressed themselves and be ready (dressed, personal belongings packed up, and lined up)

EDC can:

- Remind students to get ready

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- Check on students and remind them if they need to stay on task
- Help students gather their things and line up to go

EDC tries to be as accommodating as possible, but we don't have the staffing to make sure the students are actively getting dressed. We can remind students that it is time to get ready and help tie shoes, but it is up to the student to get themselves dressed and stay on task. It would be beneficial, particularly for K and 1st graders to have a parent present to help kids be ready on time.

Realistically, staffers can't monitor children the way a parent can in getting them dressed. The kids aren't comfortable. The staff isn't comfortable in that role. And it takes the staff away from other duties in the big room.

In the past year, there are some expectations that are unrealistic on how much EDC can offer. We want to start out the year with clear expectations and open communication to make the transitions as smooth as possible.

Updated Immunization Form Requirements

NEW! Starting August 1, 2020, all immunization records turned in to schools are required by state law to be *medically verified*. [Click here](#) for changes to WA State immunization requirements. Basically, if you submit an updated [Certificate of Immunization Status \(CIS\)](#) to the school, the form *must be certified by a healthcare provider* as well as parent/guardian.

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The simplest solution is to ask your health care provider to print a CIS for you (the right side of the CIS form will show certification from the health care provider). Parent/guardians, don't forget to sign the form twice!

What are incidental expenses?

Incidental expenses are expenses other than tuition (e.g. milk, after school care, EDC fees, classroom auction fee, yearbook, field trips, etc).

Select auto-pay for incidental expenses

Unless you set up incidental expenses to be paid on auto-pay, *you will need to authorize payment for each incidental invoice before the due date*. To make a payment, log in to **FACTS** and choose *Make a Payment*, or *Enroll in Auto Pay*.

If you selected a semi-annual payment plan in FACTS, the next tuition payment will be January 5, 2019. You will receive an email/text from FACTS four days before a scheduled automatic tuition payment (depending on the Communication Settings in your **FACTS** profile).

Avoid Late Fees in FACTS

- **Enroll in Auto-Pay for Incidental Expenses.** If you have not signed up for *auto-pay* for incidental expenses in FACTS, you will need to authorize payment for each incidental invoice before the due date. Otherwise, there will be a late fee(s) charged to your account. (To make a payment, log in to **FACTS** and choose *Make a Payment* for each incidental invoice. Or, better yet, *Enroll in Auto-Pay*).
- If there is a past due balance on your account and your communication settings are up-to-date, you will receive a **monthly statement from FACTS** on the 1st of the month.

- **Covid Protocol – has your child shown symptoms lately?** According to King County, anyone who has symptoms and has not been tested should remain at home and away from others for:
 -
 - At least 10 days from when symptoms began
 - **AND** 24 hours after fever has resolved (without fever-inducing medication)
 - **AND symptoms has improved**...whichever is longer

Return to school cmu

- No classes on campus on Friday for K-5. We have found that Fridays are necessary for independent work, family flexibility, and teachers to connect with remote students. In addition, teachers need time to prepare lessons for hybrid remote/in-person curriculum. More
- Travel reminder

-- An update on travel guidance:

On Friday after our newsletter was published, Governor Inslee [rescinded the 14 day quarantine](#) period for out-of-state travel, instead referring to the CDC

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guidance that exists. Following this change we are updating our own policy to reflect this same state and [CDC guidance](#), while reiterating that a 14-day quarantine is most effective and we still support this for your family.

"Travel increases your chance of spreading and getting COVID-19. Delay travel and stay home to protect yourself and others from COVID-19, even if you are vaccinated."

If you must travel, take steps to protect yourself and others:

- If you are eligible, get fully vaccinated for COVID-19.
- Before you travel, get tested with a viral test 1-3 days before your trip.
- Wear a mask over your nose and mouth when in public.
- Avoid crowds and stay at least 6 feet/2 meters (about 2 arm lengths) from anyone who did not travel with you.
- Get tested 3-5 days after your trip and stay home and self-quarantine for a **full 7 days** after travel, even if your test is negative. If you don't get tested, stay home and self-quarantine **for 10 days** after travel.

Please contact the school office *and* your teacher to let us know of a need to self-quarantine for out-of state travel... Many of you have already done so, but specifically updating us on your plan for these three options: best practice of a **14 day** quarantine, the "**test+7 day**", or the "**10 day**" quarantine and monitor for symptoms post-travel. Please help in letting us know in the next day or so your travel plan updates so teachers have time to prepare for post-spring break lessons.

If you are in-person, Missing school does not mean quickly pivot to remote

We have seen an increase in students reporting absent for a day from in-person learning for illness or other family needs, but then asking to be let into remote learning that day. Do not ask of your child or your child's teacher, to split their time between home/recovery needs and the learning. Whether remote or in-person, learners need to be able to focus on their school work for that day. In addition, as remarkable as our teachers are, they are not able to shift full support for the student at the drop of a hat from one mode to the other. Our attendance and absence policies ([see page 13](#) of our Family Handbook) continue to hold for making-up missed work and being present to our education whether in-person or in remote status.

Attendance Policy Reminder

In this season of unexpected illness and travel plans, we would like to remind you about OLG's attendance policy. It can be found on page 13 in the [Family Handbook](#). *Parents must notify the school office (206-935-0651) daily* when their child is absent. Student absences must include a written notice to the [classroom teacher](#) from the parent or guardian and cc the school office ([Shelley Bradley](#) and [Laura Wong](#)).

In the case of extended or pre-planned absences, parents should notify teachers via email and copy the school office with the details. Your assistance is greatly appreciated!

ATTENDANCE POLICY REMINDER

The holiday season is fast approaching and we would like to draw your attention to Prep's attendance policy. It can be found on page 35 in the [Parent/Student Handbook](#). Please note that there are limits to the number of non-school-related

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absences a student can have in a class. As long as we are learning virtually, students planning to miss more than two days should email their teachers as well as Ms. Kheriaty and Mrs. Fields to notify them of the absences and plan to make up any missed work.
